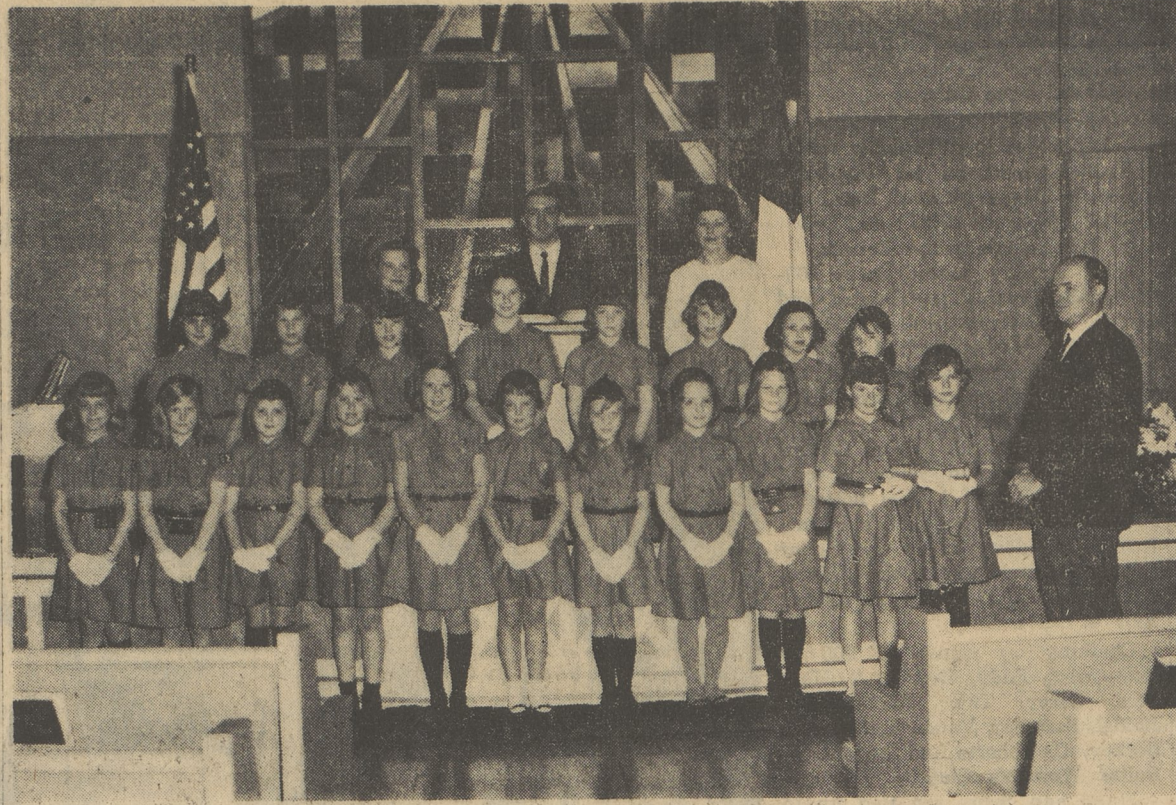

Tragedy in Jackson, Miss., reached out a long finger to touch Chase, when a tornado killed the daughter and the seven year old grandson of Mr. and Mrs. William Hughes, and injured two others last Thursday afternoon.

In the complete devastation of a crowded shopping center, Mrs. Dorothy Hughes Carpenter, 33, and her son David, lost their lives.

Injured were Timothy, 6, and Kenneth, 3. Both boys were taken to Hinds County Hospital, where at least reports Timothy was recovering following injuries to the head.

Another son, Jeffrey, nine years old, was at home when the tornado flattened the shopping center.

Atty. Charles Carpenter, in this area over the weekend for the funeral of his wife and son, returned immediately to Jackson, accompanied by Mrs. Hughes.

He reports that he had seen the menacing black funnel dipping toward the shopping center, from the window of his office building some blocks away.

She leaves in addition to her husband, her remaining sons, and her parents, a sister, Mrs. Robert Sherwood of Chase; a brother, Wayne Hughes, Laurel Park, Md.; and a foster-brother Ernest Bevan, of Chase.
