

Acme Markets Reports Record Sales, Net Down

For the 16th consecutive year, Acme Markets, Inc., rang up a new record for sales. According to the firm's annual report, released today, Acme sales reached \$1,200,749,822 in the 52 weeks ended April 2, 1966. This represents a gain of 3.4% over last year when sales reached \$1,161,198,293 in 53 weeks.

However, earnings dipped to \$3.73 per share, down from \$4.58 a year ago, adjusted for the 5% stock dividend paid March 31, 1966. Net earnings declined to \$10,450,144 from last year's \$12,883,599. 


