
The first Back Mountain Memorial Library Auction was held in 1947. We salute the Twentieth Auction and the people who, through the years, have given of themselves to make each one a success.

Howard Risley's Barnyard Notes were a special feature of The Dallas Post. The following appeared June 15, 1951.




It's Auction time again!
