## Howard Carey Dies By His Own Hand

Last Thursday, Howard Carey, 43, died by his own hand in the house in which he had lived since in Fernbrook, leaving a suicide note which explained his action as based on increasing ill health.

The deed was done with a Winchester rifle powerful enough to kill large game, and purchased somewhere in Luzerne at the same time that he bought a fishing license.

His body was not discovered in the basement of his home until the following day, when his brother and sister-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Roger Carey, next door neighbors, noted that he had not been seen on Friday.

At one time he had been a patient at Veterans Hospital. He was a veteran of World War II, a confidant which had left him extremely reticent and fearful of intrusion upon his privacy.

As he had lived, by choice, alone, he died alone and by choice.

Deputy coroner Richard Disque investigated, aided by members of the State Police and the County Coroner's office.

Mr. Carey was born at Waterton, living in Dallas for many years. His mother, Mrs. Lena Carey, died two years ago.

He leaves his brother Roger, Fernbrook; and another brother Ernest, living in New Mexico; a sister, Martha Carey, Dallas.

Burial was in Scott cemetery, Waterton, following services conducted by Rev. Grove Armstrong Saturday morning from the Disque Funeral Home.
