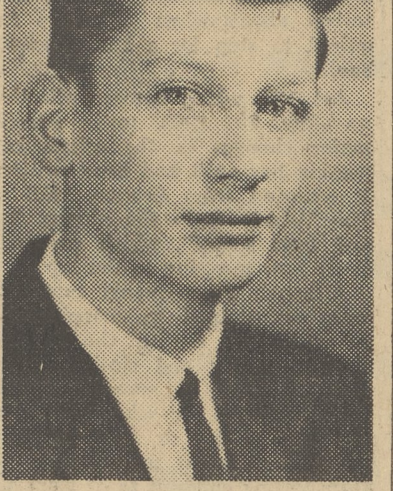

 2 ounces chopped nuts
