## The Solemn Meaning Of Yom Kippur Is Explained By One Of The Faith

Again, the Dallas Post is indebted to Mrs. Harold Saffian, who last week wrote an explanation of Rosh Hashanah for the editorial page. This week, she writes a moving story on Yom Kippur, the day of fasting and prayer which concludes the ten days of Penitence inaugurated by Rosh Hashanah.

All Jewish festivals and ceremonies start at sundown which from old Testament times has been considered the beginning of a new day.

The Day of Atonement is the holiest day of the Jewish year. It is the climax of the Ten Days of Penitence which, according to tradition, are a time for repentance, charity and prayer, in preparation for Yom Kippur.

The day is observed by fasting and prayer for more than twenty-four hours.

On Yom Kippur, Jews atone only for sins committed against God -- "but for transgressions against a fellowman the Day of Atonement does not atone, unless and until man has conciliated his fellowman and redressed the wrong he has done him."

Many Orthodox Jews wear white gowns in the synagogue to represent their longing for purity, and they remove their shoes as was the custom of the priests when treading on holy ground.

The best known prayer of Yom Kippur is Kol Nidre ("all vows"), the opening prayer chanted three times on the eve of Yom Kippur. Two confessional prayers are chanted several times during the day's services; all the sins are confessed by the whole congregation in unison.

The ancient Yom Kippur service of the High Priest in the Temple in Jerusalem is described in the moving, poetic Avodah, which is recited during the Musaf (additional) service.

The day ends with the Neilah (closing) prayer; before the "gates of Heaven" are closed, the worshippers pray that they may be "sealed" in the Book of Life.

The Day of Atonement is devoted to earnest repentance and self-examination -- to the renewal of the life of each individual and the ethical and religious life of the whole community.
