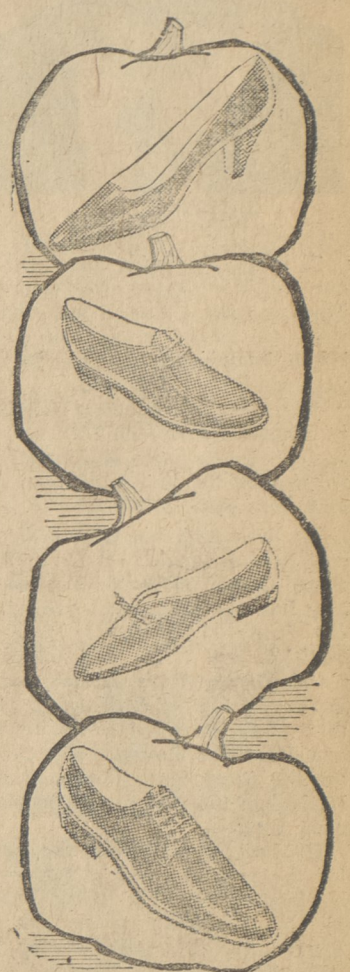
Russell Carl is the first grandchild on both sides of the family and is named after both grandfathers.
