Thursday at IME we had a celebration for Congo Independence. We had races and games at IME. The most African thing done was a bottle race. The lady who won had her pigtails done up in such a way that they formed a little basket on her head so the bottle couldn't fall off.

Bavvidinski, a senior student, won the foot race and was about the most active in all the activities. He put on a demonstration kidding the Congolese lack of respect for machinery (which I think is due to their belief that every object has a life of its own). He got Mary Clark to ride her motor bike around, then he rode Margaret Ogilvie's around, vrooming the motor, weaving back and forth, putting his feet on the handle bars, etc. In the middle he stopped and explained that he was showing the difference between the way a white person and a Congolese treats a vehicle. "You saw how she rides, nice and straight and carefully? Now watch how I do it, with all kinds of funny tricks." And off he went again. One of the other students cheered him on shouting "Ndombi!" which means "black man". At the end he said, "See, a Congolese doesn't stop to think that it cost 37,000 fr. He's ready to ruin it all in the first day." "That's all right, but another - we've got lots of money," comment-

ed another student. He could have been referring to the Congo's mineral wealth or to the 30% pay raise the workmen just got (while prices have gone and are going up much more.) In any case, such self-knowledge and criticism on the part of the country's youth is one of its hopeful signs. I would say.

Paul Blake and I came up on the train Friday. It was a nice trip, the train even got in early. I got a set of exams graded on the way.

Tomorrow morning at 5:30 we take the plane for Lodja. It will be mostly full of Methodists.

I wore my new dress to the party and carried my camera and comb in the pretty bag. Nearly everyone had slacks and more sporty clothes on but some had nice dresses. The boys of all sizes had a new style of shirt, plaid with no collar and open just a short way, more like a girl's blouse. Somebody said it came from Sears, but I don't know where the style originated. The teen-age boys had high black boots which they got made in Leo.
