

Girl Scouts Plan Safety Program

Luzerne County Association of Fire Chiefs this past week officially endorsed a Safety Program of Penn's Woods Girl Scout Council known as the S.A.L. Safety Program, ("Save A Life").

The two part program includes 1—a special training session on home safety as given by local fire departments . . . and 2—participation by the Girl Scouts in meeting their Challenge of Emergency Preparedness.

Mrs. Charles Hensley, assistant executive director of Penn's Woods Council was guest at the monthly

meeting of Luzerne County Association of Fire Chiefs and outlined the aims and purposes of the program. She said the program would be conducted each Spring by the participating fire departments . . . with the Girl Scouts using the summertime to meet their challenge of emergency preparedness . . . and come October and "Fire Prevention Week," those completing all requirements would receive certificates, badges and public recognition in ceremonies of their respective fire departments. She mentioned that the number of girls to participate in each course would be determined by the local fire companies and that arrangements for each would be handled through the Council Offices.

Mrs. Hensley said that 15 Girl Scouts completed the Pilot Study held this summer.

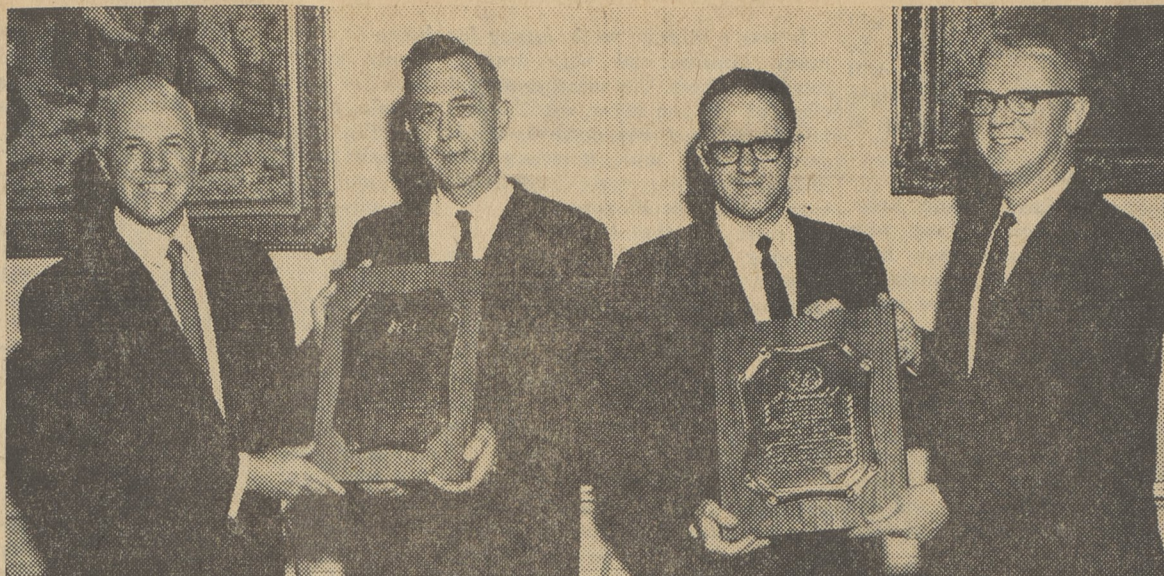
Union College is a senior liberal-arts college with an enrollment of 950 students. There are 88 students registered this fall from Pennsylvania.

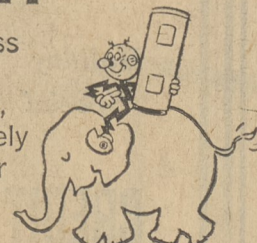
