FRANKLIN TOWNSHIP EARNED INCOME TAX
NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Franklin Township intends to enact under the authority of The Local Tax Enabling Act (Act No. 511, approved December 31, 1965), an ordinance imposing a tax of 1% on the total earned income of its residents and on all income of non-residents earned within said township; that in the judgment of the Supervisors of said Township, the imposition of said tax is necessitated by the need to provide more ample revenues for maintenance and improvement of roads and highways within said Township and the general increased costs of operating the Township government and to lessen the tax burden on real estate in said Township. The amount of revenue estimated to be derived from said tax is \$700.00 per month for each month of fiscal year 1967 that said tax may be in effect, and \$8400.00 for each fiscal year thereafter during which said tax may be continued in effect.

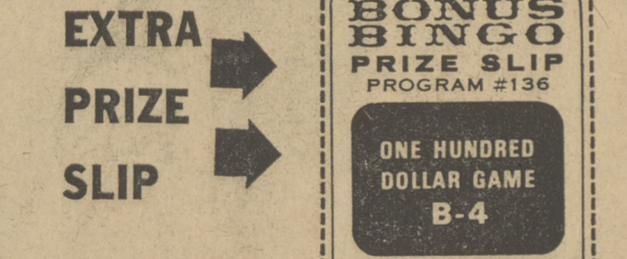

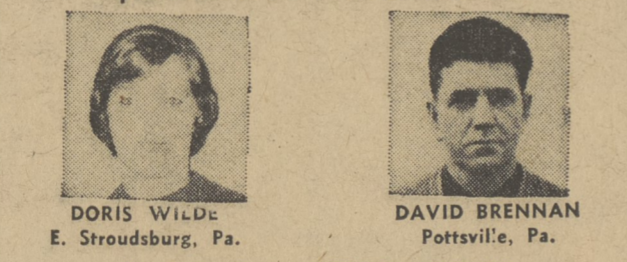

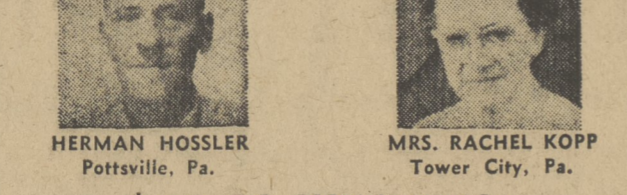
