FRANKLIN TOWNSHIP **EARNED INCOME TAX**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Franklin Township intends to enact under the authority of The Local Tax Enabling Act (Act No. 511, approved December 31, 1965), an ordinance, imposing a tax of 1% on the total earned income of its residents and on all income of nonresidents earned within said township; that in the judgment of the Supervisors of said Township, the imposition of said tax is necessitated by the need to provide more ample revenues for maintenance and improvement of roads and highways within said Township and the general increased costs of operating the Township government and to lessen the tax burden on real estate in said Township.
