Parents Must Keep Children's Confidence

To effectively guide him through childhood and adolescent experiences, parents must have a child's trust and confidence, says Mrs. Marguerite L. Duvall, extension child development and family life specialist of The Pennsylvania State University.

This parent-child relationship begins with the dependency of the infant and is nurtured by honesty, respect, and fairness.

When a child tells a parent something "as a secret," the parent must respect this confidence as if it came from another adult, Mrs. Duvall points out.

An episode that is funny to the parent may be embarrassing to the child. In revealing confidences, the parent teaches the child indirectly to withhold similar information in the future.

Children sometimes complain that a parent shows favoritism. Some situations can be handled by drawing sticks, the child with the longest stick goes first. Other impartial devices may be effective. Children are aware of parents' efforts to be fair.

When parents are honest with children, give them respect, and strive to be fair, they encourage children to continue to trust and have confidence in them, Mrs. Duvall adds.

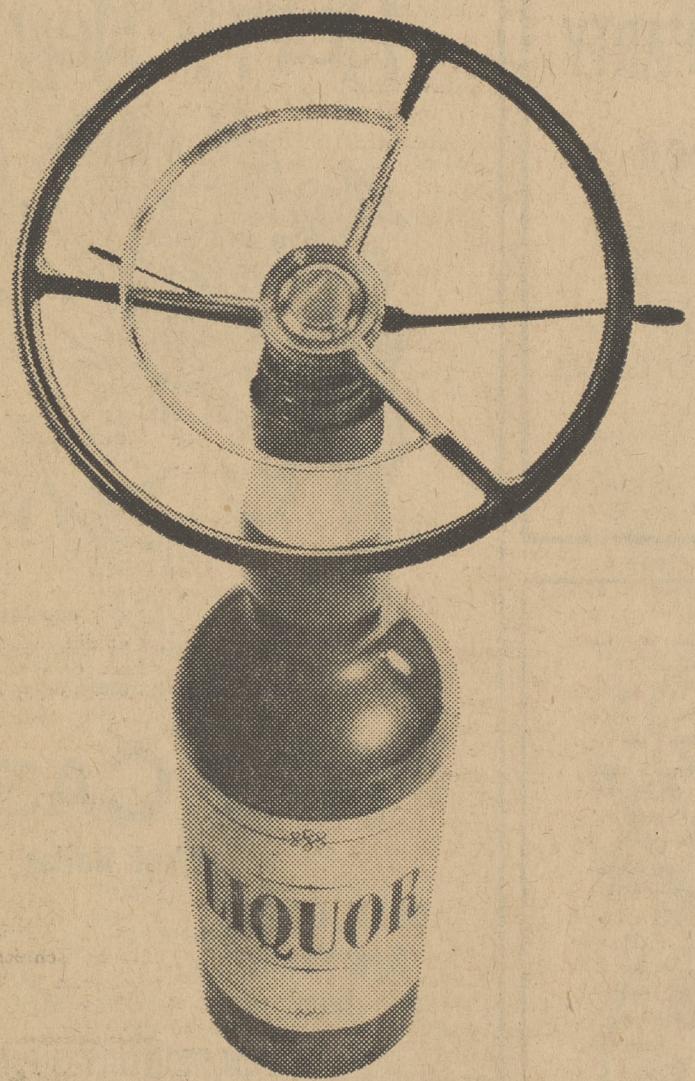
