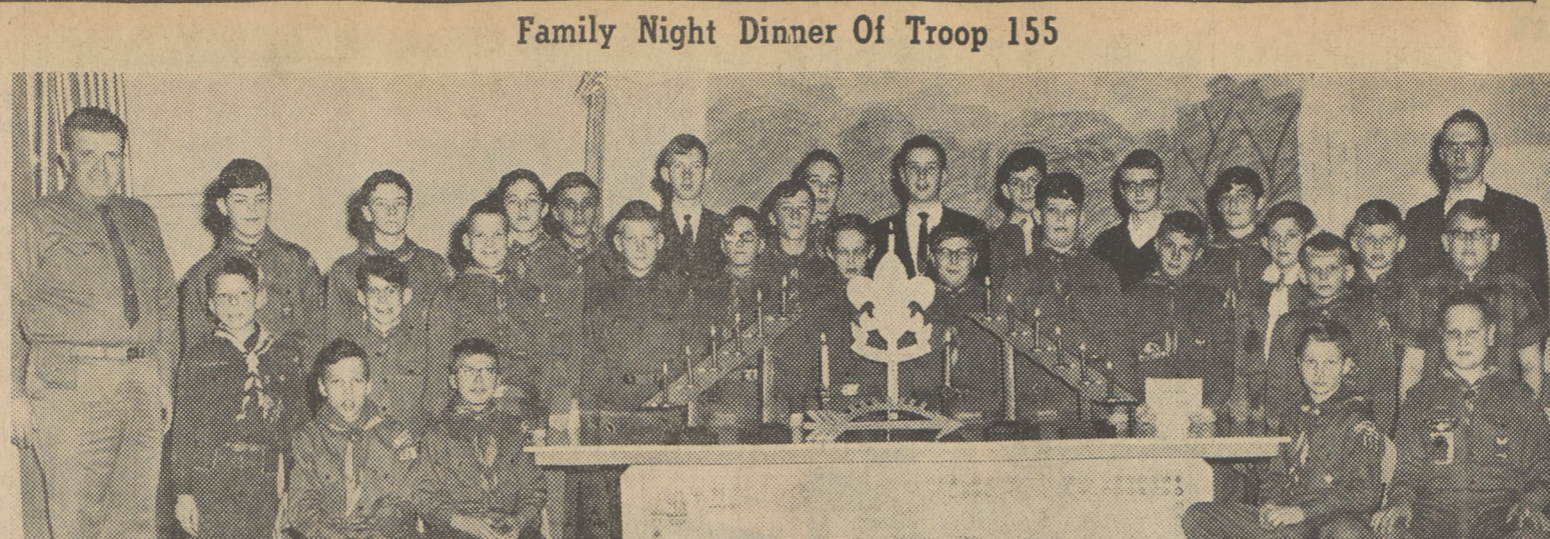
Sara Jean Otto, Honored At Wilson College

Coast Guard Invites College Men

College men are now being offered an opportunity to fulfill their military obligation as officers in U. S. Coast Guard aviation.

The Coast Guard Aviation (AV CAD) Program is available to qualified applicants who have successfully completed two years of college work and can successfully qualify on the aviation selection tests.

Training is conducted at Pensacola, Florida, and Corpus Christi, Texas. Approximately 18 months after the training starts, the aviation cadets will be commissioned as ensign in the U. S. Coast Guard Reserve to serve as an aviator for 3½ years after commissioning.
