Herman Kern States Views

Herman Kern, Republican Candidate for Mayor of Harveys Lake Borough on the mayor council slate was asked why he entered politics. The veteran Harveys Lake business man replied that it was because he did not want to see Harveys Lake Borough fall into the hands of a small group who might cater to the whims of a few and disregard the welfare of the average Lake resident.

Commenting on the group working for a Borough-Manager type of government, Mr. Kern stated that these people did not seem to have confidence in their own candidates. He pointed out that the candidates backed by the Executive Committee not only had to pledge themselves to be for a borough manager, but had to sign affidavits to this effect. "When a group of candidates allow themselves to be led in this manner," said Kern, "it is no wonder they need a Borough Manager to do their thinking for them."

Questioned about his reaction to the opposing slate's tax collector candidates pledging to return their commission less expenses to help defray the cost of a Borough Manager, Kern inquired, "Exactly how much will be left after expenses?" Expanding on the issue of a Borough Manager being paid with a rebate from a tax collector's commission, Kern asked, "What will happen to the Borough Manager if a tax collector is elected in future years who chooses to keep his commission?" Answering his own question, Kern

replied "I'll tell you exactly what will happen, taxes will be raised substantially to meet the Manager's salary."

Continuing his discussion of a Borough Manager, Kern commented that good Borough Managers are hard to find, and that this would be especially true in the case of Harveys Lake Borough, due to the small number of residents, and the inability to pay the high salary usually obtained by such managers.

"It is my fear," stated Kern, "that after a fruitless search for a qualified man, the Executive Committee will force the Council to accept an unqualified substitute for the job and the taxpayers of Harveys Lake Borough will suffer the consequences."

When asked about his own slate, Kern replied that he and his running mates had pledged themselves to no individual or group, but intended to work for the welfare of Harveys Lake Borough and every individual in it. "We will be an active team," stated Kern, "All of us are willing to put every possible effort into forming and operating the New Borough Government. We realize this will be a great task, but we feel equal to it and would never think of dodging our responsibilities by passing them on to a Borough Manager that the taxpayers cannot afford."

As a parting thought, Kern added, "you know, it's much harder for small special interest groups to control a Mayor and seven councilmen than it is for them to gain control of a Borough Manager. This," said Herman, "is something for every member to consider." Adv.
