James Wyant Observes 75th Birthday Tuesday

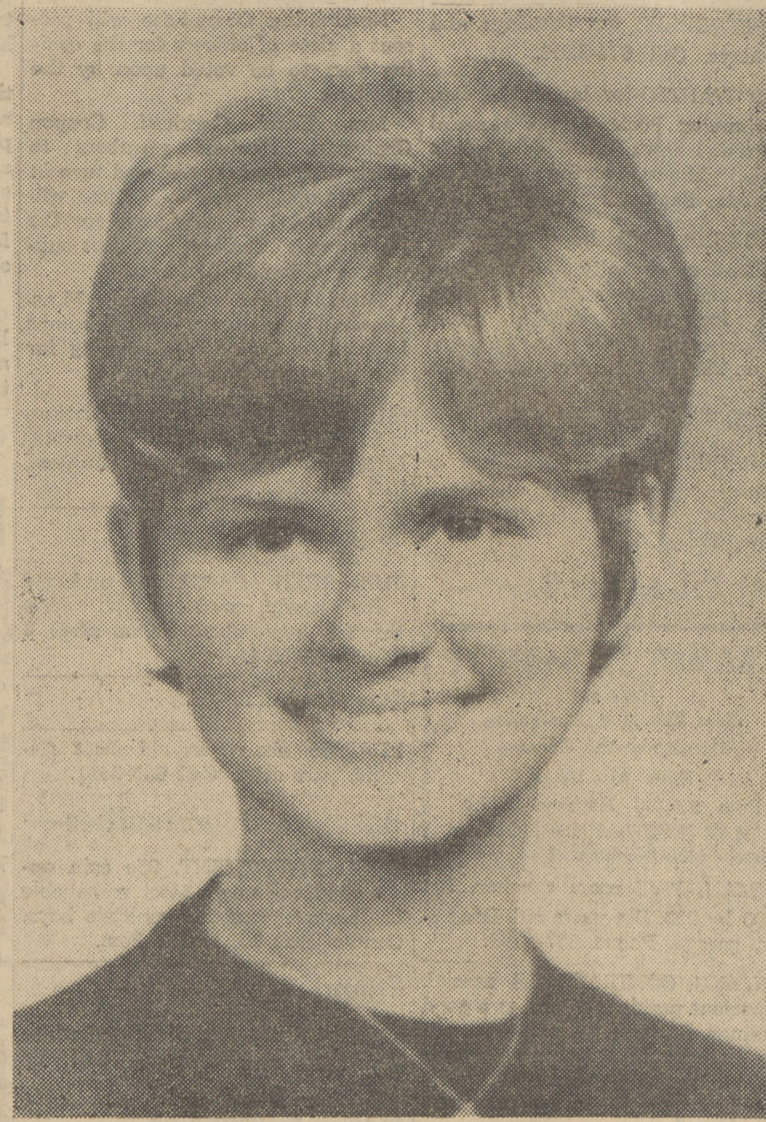
