She Was Nearing The Century Mark

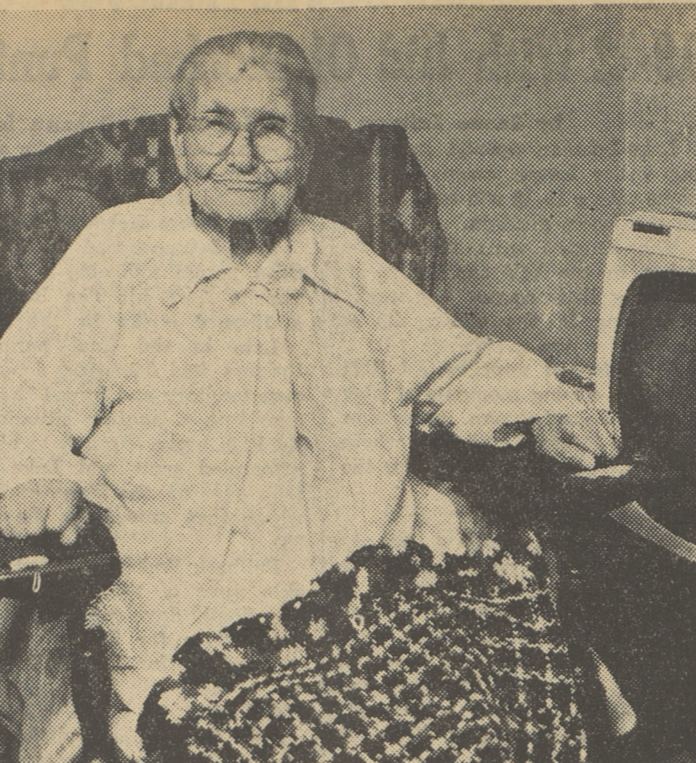
