Ecumenical Festival Of Faith And Praise Sunday At Wilkes Gymnasium



The 1967 Festival of Faith will be held on Sunday evening, October 1 at 7 p. m. in the Wilkes College Gymnasium. The Festival of Faith and Praise has been sponsored by the Wyoming Valley Council of Churches for more than twenty years, and has been one of the annual inspirational highlights in the life of the churches of the Valley and their united witness during that time. This year's guest speaker will be the Rev. Dr. Hagen Staack, Professor at Muhlenberg College, Allentown, and an official observer at Vatican II. Dr. Staack, a Lutheran by faith, was on close personal terms with the late Pope John XXIII, and cherishes many intimate recollections of that relationship.

Last year's Festival of Faith drew nearly 1,000 worshippers. This year, with the full participation of the Diocese of Scranton and the encouragement of members to attend, it was felt that the event should be held in the Wilkes College gymnasium, in order to provide an opportunity for the greatest number of worshippers to attend. This year's chairman is the Rev. Andrew Pillarella, minister of the Trinity United Presbyterian Church, Dallas.

A new feature in this year's Festival of Faith will be an area-wide interfaith choir, under the direction of Walter W. Umla, Director of music of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, Kingston. Organist will be Mrs. George O'Donnell, organist and Director of Choirs at St. Mary's Church, Wilkes-Barre.

The special anthems that will be sung by the Interfaith Choir will be: "Got Not Far From Me," by Zingarelli; and "Alleluia, Amen!" from "Judas Maccabaeus," by Handel. Choir directors who may need additional information are asked to call Mr. Umla, Mrs. Leland Bloemer, Dean of the Wyoming Valley Chapter of the American Guild of Organists, or Myron G. Leet, past-Dean. Mr. Umla is presently the sub-Dean of the Wyoming Valley Chapter.

Marshal of this year's clergy procession will be the Rev. Robert D. Daffin, minister of Memorial Presbyterian Church, Wilkes-Barre. Assistant marshals will be Rev. Thomas A. Flynn, assistant pastor of Gate of Heaven Church, Dallas; and the Rev. Russell C. Lavry, minister of the First Methodist Church, West Pittston and former minister of the Dallas Methodist Church. Clergy of both faiths are invited to participate in the procession and are asked to assemble promptly at the Wilkes College Gym at 6:30 p. m. All clergy are asked to bring and plan to wear their formal garb.
