

Dallas Edges Plains By 7-6

Scott Lefko's Kick Provides Margin

Dallas Mountaineers captured their second win in a row last Friday night as they upset Plains 7-6 before some 2,000 onlookers at Plains stadium. It was Dallas' first WV conference victory.

A first period touchdown by Bob Parry and Scott Lefko's placement provided the margin of victory as the Plainsmen scored the lonemarker in the third period and the attempted PAT hit the crossbar and bounded off to the side.

Dallas put the opening kick-off in play on its own 32-yard line and behind the running of Parry along with a 30-yard pass play, Lefko to Ruckno, Dallas reached the Plains 10. Two plays later Parry cracked over to climax a 68-yard drive. Scott Lefko then proceeded to boot the all-important PAT.

Dallas missed out on another scoring opportunity in the second period when Plains halted a drive on the Red Raiders 15.

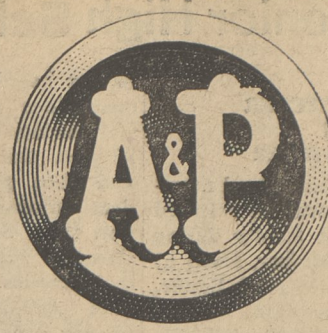
