C. M. To Present Film, "The Virgin Spring"

"The Virgin Spring", a film by Ingmar Bergman, will be shown this evening, March 14, at 7:30, in Walsh Auditorium in conjunction with College Misericordia's Faculty Student Seminars. Public is invited.

Bergman in "The Virgin Spring" has moved into the deep crucial places of tragic art, into the abiding forest which surrounds our daytime and gives the lie to our belief that all contingent evils can be socialized away," according to the Film Quarterly.

The most compact visual of all Bergman's films, the Film Quarterly also stated that "The Virgin Spring" is strictly composed, as a sonnet, pictorially; each image contains, predicts or recalls every other image—the sustained reverberation of a bell in which the original note and final overtone sound as a continuum to the ear.

Proceeding the film will be a short introduction given by Vincent Maier, physics instructor.

David Payne, English instructor, will be the chairman of the Friday seminar. Other members of the panel are: Rudolf Berger, language instructor, Rev. Joseph Gibbon, theology instructor, Max Schleicher, math instructor and Maier.

Each panel member will present a commentary of the film in relation to his field of study.
