Some orders have already been received for the 100 page book of pictures taken during the Olde Dallas Sesquicentennial. The book is now being bound and will be ready for distribution soon.

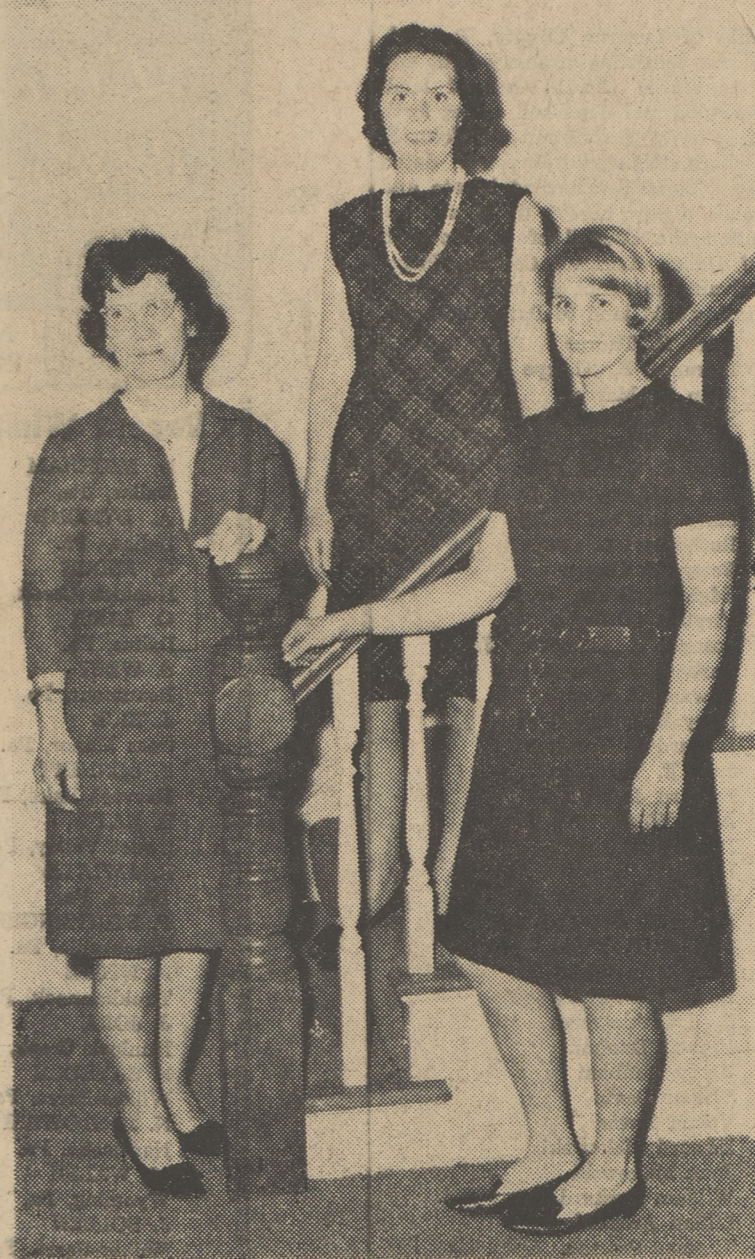
