Apple Blossom Festival To Feature Many Events

The Shenandoah Apple Blossom Festival has been held each year since 1924, except during World War II. More than 150,000 persons flock to the "Apple Capital" and the area each spring. The orchards of the region are then pink and white against the new-green of the hills and the Shenandoah Valley is at its loveliest.

The three day program features a Queen, Princesses, notables and celebrities, a colorful Pageant of Springtime, elaborate Coronation ceremony for Queen Shenandoah, the Firemen's and Grand Feature Parades (the latter featuring 60 floats and 90 bands), the selection of "Miss Shenandoah Apple Blossom", Apple Pie Baking Contest, Apple Blossom Twirling event, Antique Car Meet, and Shenandoah Country Music Jubilee. Concerts, dances, historic-scenic tours and exhibits round out the schedule. The Festival's heartiest boosters are those who have sampled the Shenandoah Valley and the Appalachian Fruit Growing Areas of Virginia, West Virginia, Maryland and Pennsylvania in the spring.

Winchester, home of the Festival, is a busy city with a population of 15,000 people. It lies nestled comfortably in the northern end of the Shenandoah Valley and is the oldest English settlement west of the Blue Ridge. As in year gone by, when the Shawnee Indians roamed this area and settlers raised here on their westward trek, Winchester is still a favorite stopping-off point for those moving on to the great Alleghenies.

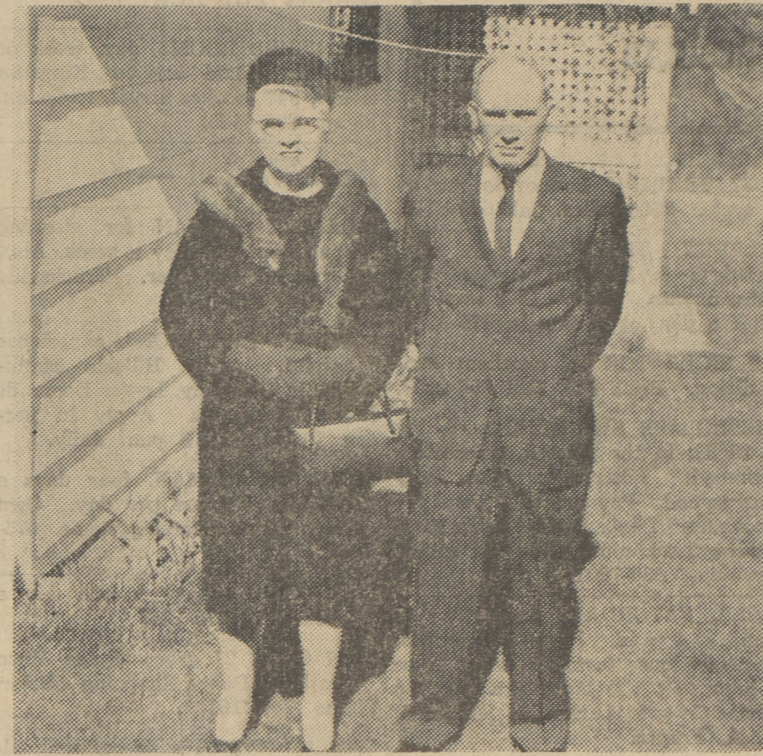
