The award is given for years of outstanding service given to the International Order of Rainbow for Girls.

## Scholarship Awarded To Dallas Homemaker

Mrs. Ludwig Pasquini, a local mother of four and junior elementary-special education major at College Misericordia, has been awarded a \$500 scholarship by the Pennsylvania Federation of Women's Clubs. Her home is on James Street, RD 1, Dallas.

The scholarship, one of 50 presented throughout Pennsylvania, has a twofold purpose. It is designed to encourage professional preparation in the field of Special Education and to interest women in returning to college once obligations to home and family have been met.

In addition to receiving the scholarship, Mrs. Pasquini is also one of four women selected as panel members for a three-day summer session at Penn State University. At the twelfth annual session beginning July 17, she will share with women from all over the state her experiences at Misericordia and subsequent views on returning to school.

Mrs. Pasquini, known on campus as Liz, graduated from high school in 1947, married in 1948 and returned to school as a college freshman in 1965. By attending summer sessions, she will be eligible for a degree in 1969.

Before returning to school, Mrs. Pasquini served as a licensed nursing student. It was while nursing that she became aware of the many children suffering from emotional problems, and of the need for special educators. Mrs. Pasquini also noted that raising a family intensified this awareness of children's needs.

The Pasquini family consists of daughter Carol, a freshman physical education major at East Stroudsburg, and sons Terry, a high school freshman, Kevin, fifth grade, and Shawn, third grade, all students in the Dallas School System.

A resident of the area for the past five years, Mrs. Pasquini is keenly interested in community affairs. A volunteer at Retreat State Hospital, she is also a member of the area Council of Mental Health.

In conjunction with her studies in elementary and special education, Mrs. Pasquini is currently involved in an internship in the six-year-old transition class at Westmoreland. Her plans for the future include a possible master's degree in either Psychology or Special Education.

His son, George Palmer Ransom, settled in Plymouth. For many years he served as Colonel of the militia regiment of Luzerne County which was the forerunner of the 109th Field Artillery.

Other organizations to which Mrs. Prutzman belongs include the Hagerman Society of Pennsylvania, Northumberland Co. Historical Society, and the Wyoming Monument Association.

A 1948 graduate of Lehman High School she attended Bloomsburg State College and is an alumna of Wyoming Seminary Dean School of Business.

Mr. and Mrs. Prutzman, who resides at Windswept Farms in Rush Township, Northumberland Co., attends the Rush Baptist Church where Mrs. Prutzman is director of the choir and president of the Missionary Society. The Prutzmans have two children, David and Suzanne.

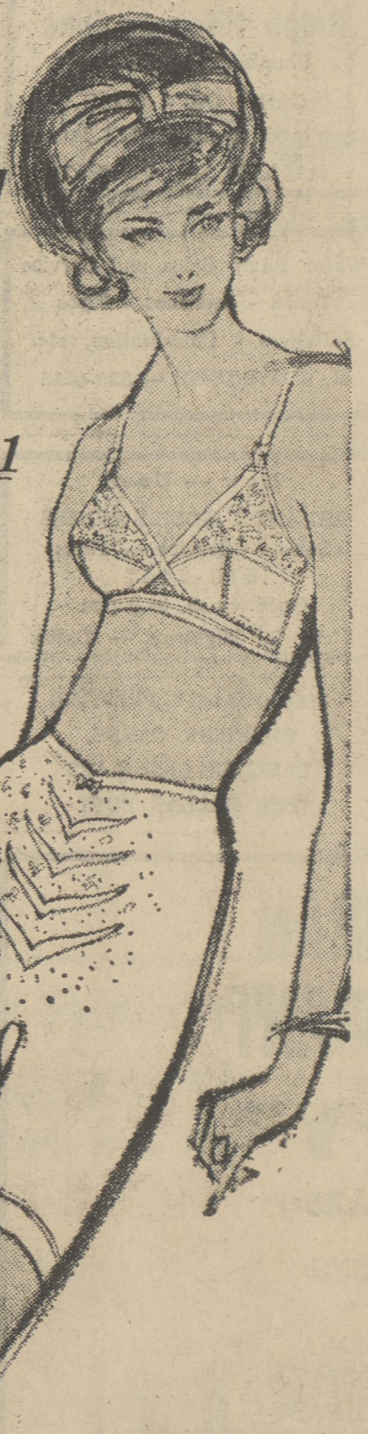
### Howard Wiener Elected As Projects Officer

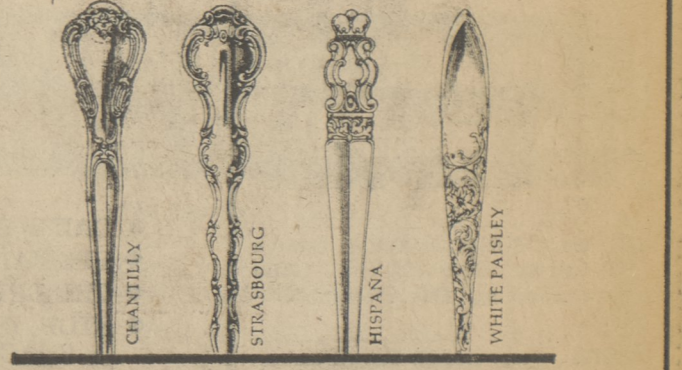
