Nancy's Letters Continue From The Mission Field In West Africa

Nancy Schimmel's mother, Mrs. Clarence Elston, again shares excerpts from her letters, written from the Lutheran Training Institute in Salayea, Liberia, West Africa, near the Guinea border.

We spent a few days at Nimba. I know I would feel badly if I left without showing her, so I asked her to come. She has a small baby, Kpanah, and we fixed a bed for it in my clothes basket. She made bread, buns, banana cookies and banana doughnuts. All turned out well. She was so pleased and her husband was thrilled. Flumo Gorlu and his friend just came with a bucket of wild honey. We ate some and really enjoyed it.

The Lutheran missionaries here took us and two Methodist families on a tour of the mines which was quite interesting. At one point we were actually higher than an airplane which was flying around. We saw how they dig the ore, crush it and place it on conveyor belts from the top down into the valley where it is loaded into railroad cars and taken to the port of Buchanan.

We took pictures of three Methodist Churches and one Hospital on the way to Nimba. The Church at Ganta is a beautiful stone Church, and the hospital and leper colony across the road seems large and quite modern. A short distance up the road is a shop where the lepers sell things they have made. We bought a few. Since we came, Louise, the head carpenter's wife has wanted to learn how to bake bread and cookies. Because of my work in the office, I never had an opportunity to teach

Vocal selections with guitar accompaniment and a special story for the children will be given each night.

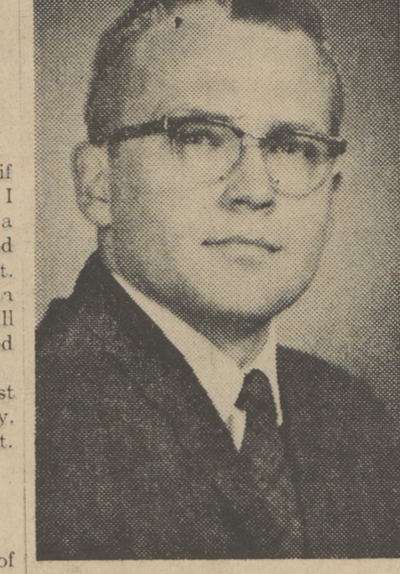
