K. T. Board To Add Service

Residents Cut Off By New Highway Seek Aid

Initiation of an answering service to the police and removal of the two way radio, now in the municipal building, to the home of Chief of Police Herbert Updyke was approved at a meeting of Kings-Township Supervisors last week. The new approach to more efficient contact with the police was suggested by LeRoy Ziegler. Chairman Edward Hall said he saw no sense in keeping the radio in the building where no one was on duty. To expedite matters, Richard Mathers first moved that the answering service be accepted at a cost of \$17.50 monthly plus mileage in wiring. He then moved to have radio removed to Updyke's residence. All voted in favor.

A curbing placed by the State highway department in construction of Rt. 309 in the vicinity near Woodlawn Inn brought complaints from residents of a one way exit and poor condition of a small strip of Old Main Street. Mrs. Handlos protested that a neighbor parking on the narrow lane blocked traffic and Mrs. Rowlands asked for black-topping. Determination of ownership will be established by the board.

Despite a letter from the State Engineer stating Franklin Street Bridge needed no immediate repairs, Chairman Hall said it would be replaced now removing any danger to pedestrians or motorists. Mr. Ziegler asked if this would solve Shavertown Fire Company objection and Hall replied that if necessary Trucksville Fire Company would come forth. Signs allowing 7,000 tons will be erected and Mr. Culver remarked that much heavier loads were going over the structure safely. Letters will be sent of the Board's intent to both Shavertown Fire Company and Kingston Township Ambulance Association.

Intent To Bargain  
A letter from Police Chief Updyke informed supervisors that collective bargaining concerning compensation, hours, retirement and pension is in the offing under State Bill 1343. New minimum salary rates of \$5200 per annum will go into effect as of August 27.

No third police officer was appointed. Ziegler moved to place large amount in check accounts into Savings certificates. Board approved rezoning of Harris Hill sector from Agricultural to Residential Area.

Light Unfair  
Mr. Konnick claimed light at Harris Hill only gives motorists and pedestrians three seconds to cross and that Shavertown traffic signals were confusing. He said weeds are a nuisance on Heller's Grove and guard rails near Harris Hill Bridge are in poor shape offering no protection. Mr. Hall said all issues would be checked and announced that the Department of Forests and Waters were being contacted to dredge Toby's Creek.

Residents Gripe At Jackson Twp.

Jackson Board of Supervisors met on July 3, with all three members of the Board present, also their secretary, Edward Jeffery and solicitor Jonathan Valentine, police officers, J. P.'s and 25 residents.

Roadmaster Bertram reported all blacktop repaired and pot-holes filled. Some calcium to be spread on repaired areas, then weeds and brush will be cut.

A letter from the Rev. Mr. Charles Gommer was read concerning the possibility of a consolidation of police forces. Chief Cooper stated the idea had been advanced several years ago, but a cost of \$100,000 for cruisers and centralized communications system was prohibitive. A member of the Board will attend any area meeting called on the subject. Chief Cooper says the present cooperation between police forces and fire companies in Back Mountain is excellent and effective.

There is a need for a full-time police officer, and the possibility of imposing a right-to-work tax to pay for this protection is an idea advanced and discussed.

Chairman Lamoreaux reported he had received many calls concerning damage to property caused by blasting at American Asphalt Co. plant. Also, company has been disregarding hours of work and noise is disturbing the sleep of many people in area. The Board met with Banks Bros. and talked over the problems. Banks suggested a meeting of company heads, supervisors and a committee of property owners in area. Residents refuse to meet with them, feel nothing will be accomplished at such a meeting.

In 1959, and again in 1965 the same problems came up. Meetings were held, agreements with the company were made, kept for a brief time, then broken. Since some of the hours of operations are opposed to local zoning laws, zoning officer is to proceed to take action against the company.

Operating hours are supposed to be from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. daily except Sundays. As evidence of disregard of these hours, firemen have been called to extinguish three fires at the plant at hours other than those permitted by zoning laws.
