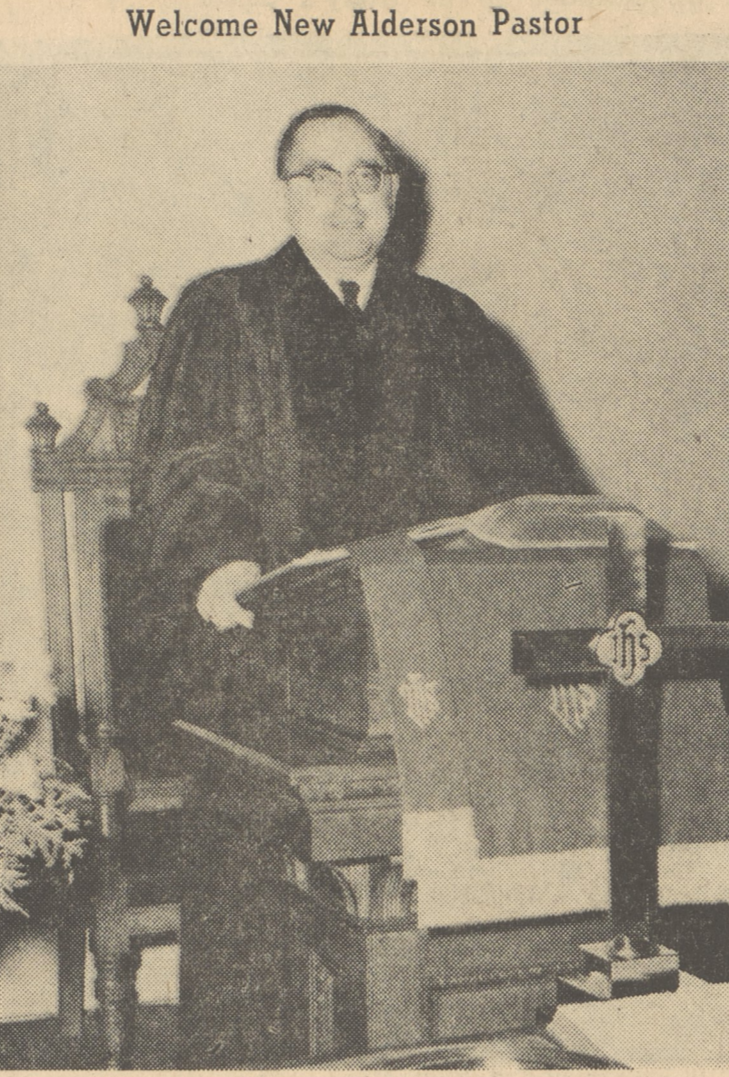
**Fatally Injured On Red Hill Road**

## Holiest Day For Jewish People

Yom Kippur starts October 1, at sundown, ends October 2 at sundown.

The most sacred Hebrew holy day, is a day of prayer for forgiveness for sins committed during the year. The Jews gather in synagogues on the Eve of Yom Kippur, when the fast begins, and return the following morning to continue confessing, doing penitence, and praying for forgiveness. The most solemn prayer, Kol Nidre, is chanted on the eve of Yom Kippur.  
 The days of Gosh Hashana are the ten days of penitence preceding Yom Kippur, when all the people of the earth pass before the Lord and are marked on the Book of Life or in the Book of Death.

A distinguishing feature of the New Year is the blowing of the shofar, or ram's horn, which summons Jews to their penitential observance.  
 "Do justly, love mercy, walk humbly with thy G-d."
