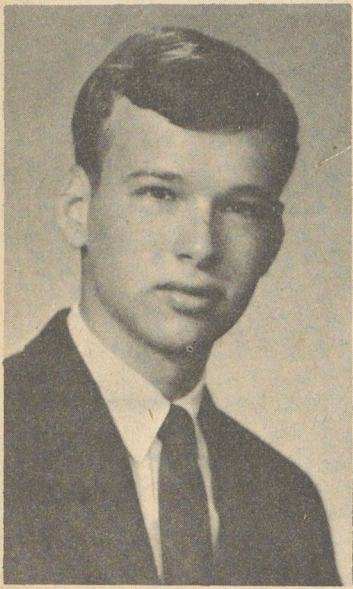

REVIEW

Allen Drury will of necessity have to write another political novel at once, in order to relieve the minds of the people who have already read his latest masterpiece of Washington intrigue, "Preserve and Protect."

"Preserve and Protect" is a cliff-hanger. A reader may project himself into the story, he may think that one solution is the only possible one, but he is left with the nagging suspicion that he might be wrong.

The book, dealing with the same characters that appeared in "Advise and Consent," and "Capable of Honor," all written against the background of Washington politics, and building in tension with each volume, shows a merciless analysis of news media and of columnists.

The book was in the making before the assassinations of Senator Robert Kennedy and Dr. Martin Luther King. It portrays a truly frightening disregard of law and the prevalence of crime.

The last sentence catapults the reader into the future, where a darling of the people and a strong and courageous man who has labored long to gain the presidential nomination, join hands before the fatal shot which blasts one husband and one wife into eternity.

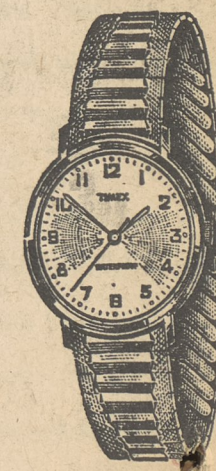

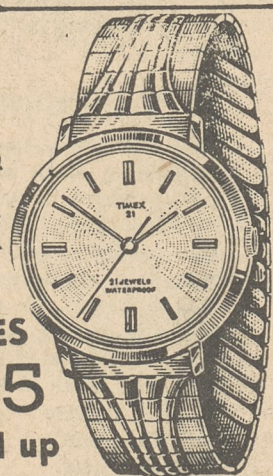

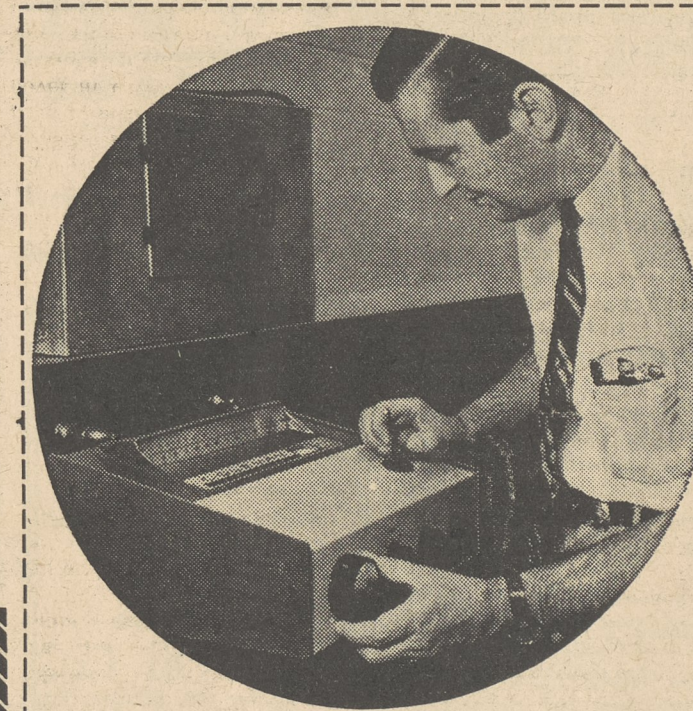
