JOHANNESBURG (AP) — World food and population problems may eventually have to be solved by euthanasia, a Witwatersrand (Johannesburg) University international affairs lecturer said here.

Prof. B. Cockram told a public meeting the obvious way to beat population increases is to reverse present decreased mortality trends "either by removing the causes of improvement or by killing off the aged before they otherwise die. Euthanasia for the aged would probably be preferred if a choice had to be made."

Cockram himself is 65. His speech aroused a storm of protest, particularly among aged people, and he hastened to add he is not recommending euthanasia.

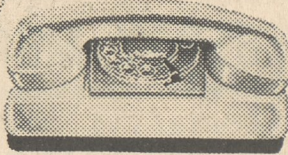

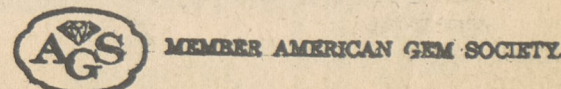
