

By August 1771, the Yankees had suffered enough due to lack of precautions, and from that time on posted guards and lookouts and built fortified blockhouses and forts in all the settled townships. Dates are approximate, but the best known were Fort Ogden (1769), Fort Durkee (1769), Fort Wyoming (1771), the Yankee redoubt later, and Fort Wilkes-Barre before 1778, all in Wilkes-Barre. Stewarts blockhouse in Hanover (1771), and a Fort Shawanee in Plymouth protected the lower end. Fort Jenkins (1776) and Fort Brown or Pittston (1772), at the upper end. On the Kingston side stood Forty Fort (1770), one opposite Mille Creek, another opposite Fort Wyoming, and probably others. Fort Wintermoot, not Yankee, was opposite Pittston.


