antlerless deer can be taken

Sportsmen planning to concentrate on the "buckshot area" in southeastern Pennsylvania are reminded that they will have 18 days in which to take an antlerless deer if they possess an antlerless license for the county in which they are hunting.

According to game commission officials, from now through Saturday, Dec. 20, hunters can take antlerless deer in the "buckshot area" if they have been issued antlerless deer licenses for the area where they are hunting.

Antlered deer may be taken in the "buckshot area" through Dec. 13. No deer can be taken on Sundays.

The "buckshot area" and special regulations governing hunting there are fully described in the Digest of Pennsylvania Hunting and Trapping Regulations for 1969-70 issued with each hunting license.

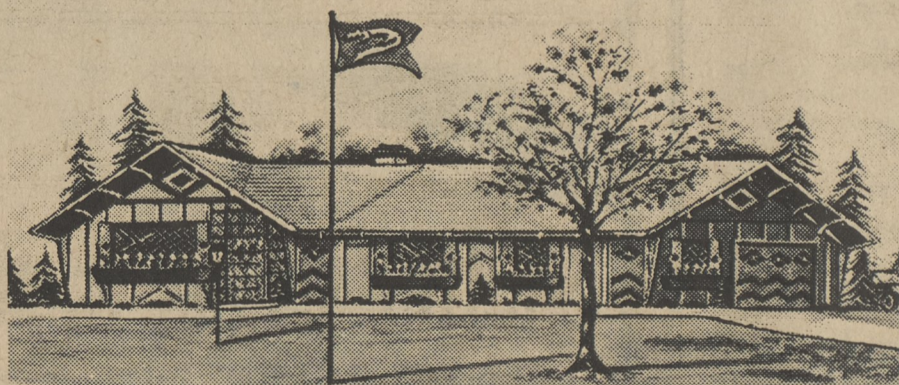
