# Montessori school to open in October

It has been announced that a Montessori school will open in the Wyoming Valley area in October of 1970. It will be centrally located, probably in Wilkes-Barre or Kingston, in order to serve both the Back Mountain and Mountaintop areas as well as the valley. Pre-registration of children aged 2½ to 5 years is presently taking place. Only 40 children will be accepted so early registration is advisable. There will be two sessions daily; a morning session from 9 to 12 and an afternoon session from 1 to 4 p.m.

There is presently a Montessori study group, consisting of parents and interested people, that is looking for a site for the school and will hire a specially trained Montessori teacher and two aides. The group is being advised by Sister Philip Mary who heads a Montessori school in Scranton. They are a non-

profit organization. Any possible profits from tuition would be used for scholarships for underprivileged children or to educate emotionally disturbed children.

A spokesman for the group said, "Montessori is a new concept in education that offers a tremendous chance for children to develop at their own rate. It offers a carefully planned environment for the child to develop individually. There are approximately 400 Montessori schools in this country now."

There will be a preregistration meeting held Tuesday, Jan. 6, at the Forty Fort site of the Wyoming Seminary Day School, 1560 Wyoming Avenue. All interested parents are welcome to attend.
