trailer wheels smash car, truck

A dual wheel tractor-trailer belonging to the COD Corp., Kingston, lost its two rear wheels Monday afternoon while traveling south on Route 309 near the Overbrook Avenue underpass.

The runaway tires crossed into the northbound lane and demolished a car driven by Anthony S. Leptuck, Swoyersville, then smashed into the left rear fender of a panel truck operated by Michael Tetrylak, Hanover Township. Mr. Tetrylak was uninjured and Mr. Leptuck was treated at Nesbitt Memorial Hospital for shock before being discharged.

Damage to the car was estimated at \$1200, while damage to the panel truck was listed at \$65.

The tractor-trailer, operated by Frank Sawicki Jr., Plymouth, traveled a few hundred feet before coming safely to a stop.

The accident was investigated by Dallas Township patrolman Carl Miers, Dallas Township police chief Frank Lange, Dallas patrolman Raymond Titus, and Dallas constable James Davies.

take a negative view in that some replied "yes," but with reservations, such as "excluding X-rated" and some said the question "is loaded with ifs."

On the question "Do you think the new code of rating motion pictures is good or bad?" 80 percent said "good," 20 percent said it was "bad," and others said it could be better or had no opinion.

Additional comments on the entire survey were: "If one has not the self discipline to refrain from low-down amusement, then he should be prohibited from seeing such by law."

"If cigarettes are considered to be a physical detriment, we feel that X-rated movies are a mental detriment. Of the two, we feel that a mental detriment is by far more important than any physical detriment."

"The movie houses should exercise more care in letting in minors."

"I don't think anyone should have the right to tell me what movies to see."

"If a person is old enough to fight for his country at 18, he is old enough to vote and see X-rated movies. My age is 25."

Watchtower directs circuit assembly

empt status. He quoted studies made by the United States Office of Education which revealed that the cost of educating a single student at a four-year tax supported college is approximately \$2500 per year. On this basis, he pointed out, the 6444 Pennsylvania students now studying in NEPIC colleges—schools not supported by State taxes—save Pennsylvania taxpayers more than \$15,900,000 each year.

Said the NEPIC spokesman, "Tax exemption seems to be a very small price to pay for this return."

Rep. John C. Pittenger, chairman of the nine-man committee before which the Wilkes College dean appeared, suggested that the house bills protested by Dr. Micheline "may never see the light of day."

He stated that his committee will evaluate information gleaned from the capitol hearing as well as from similar hearings conducted in Pittsburgh and Philadelphia and will then decide which of several bills dealing with real estate taxation to introduce before the full House of Representatives.

According to Mr. Pittenger, the committee will be prepared to submit the bills by mid-March.
