Gouldsboro child to adorn Easter poster

The board of directors of the Northeastern Pennsylvania Society for Crippled Children and Adults have selected three year old Lynda Kolebar as the 1970 Easter Seal poster child. She was also the center of attraction at Marywood College campus Jan. 22, when she participated in a mock diagnostic and evaluation clinic sponsored by the society, Chapter 416 Council for Exceptional Children and the Graduate School of Special Education.

Lynda was born with a birth defect known as spina bifida, which has left her paralyzed from the waist down. Lynda had corrective surgery at a local hospital when she was only one week old and the family was referred to the Northeastern Pennsylvania Society for Crippled Children and Adults by her physician for follow-up care. At that time the Society assisted the family in securing leg braces and corrective shoes. A walker and crutches have also been furnished through the society's program of direct services.

"Life in front of the camera and public eye is not new for Lynda," stated J. Wayne Morgan, director of information for the society. "Her first task began at the ground-breaking ceremonies for the new center, where she aided Frank Ross,

Dalton, president of the society, in removing the first shovelful of earth from the construction site.

"Moby Dick" on new stamp

"Moby Dick," the great white whale set in a blue oval, is the face of the new six cent stamp issued by the United States Post Office March 7. Above the design, contributed by artist Bradbury Thompson, are the words "Herman Melville" in white and underneath the design is "Moby Dick, United States 6" also in white.

The commemorative stamped envelope was first placed on sale at New Bedford, Mass., the once mighty site of the whaling industry. First day cancellations were available to collectors from the New Bedford Postmaster.

The entry fee for the special class in household pets is ten dollars. To date, only ten household pets have been entered by area residents to com-

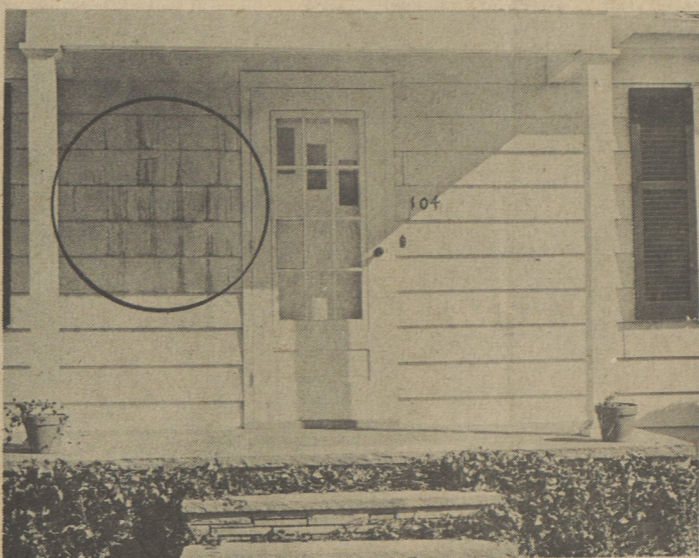
pete for 25 trophies and two Rosettes. For the pedigreed classes, the entries now stand at 218, with cats represented from all over the United States and Canada.

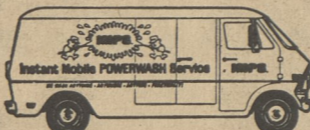

warns against possible floods

The Office of Emergency Preparedness in Washington is moving to prepare for possible potential flooding in Pennsylvania, U.S. Sen. Hugh Scott (R-Pa.) announced today.

The response from the Office of Emergency Preparedness came quickly after Senator Scott's warning last week that a dangerous and disastrous flood situation may exist throughout the State of Pennsylvania.

Scott, Senate Republican Leader, reported that the Office of Emergency Preparedness has asked the Army Corps

of Engineers to assist in determining likely flood areas throughout the Commonwealth.

"The Army Corps of Engineers will reach the determination by close consultation with the U.S. Weather Bureau," Scott said. "The Weather Bureau has been accumulating statistics on the snow cover, soil water accumulation levels and rainfall probabilities throughout the State. The Corps is going to fully investigate levy building and sand bag placement needs."
