## show to feature Ford Model-T

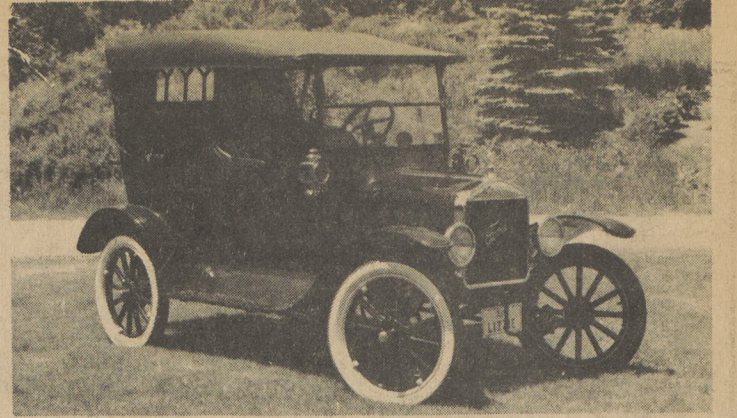

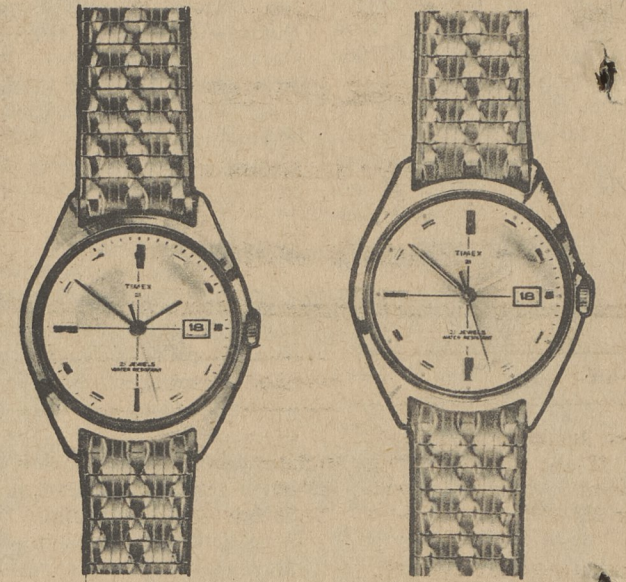
