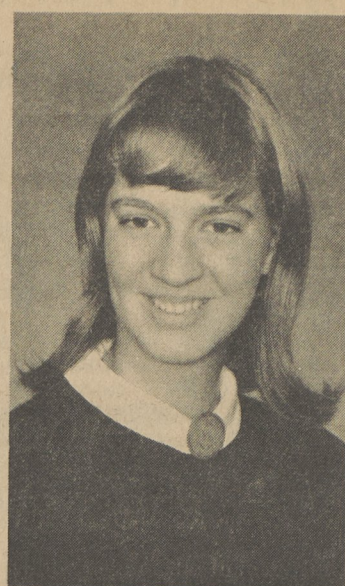




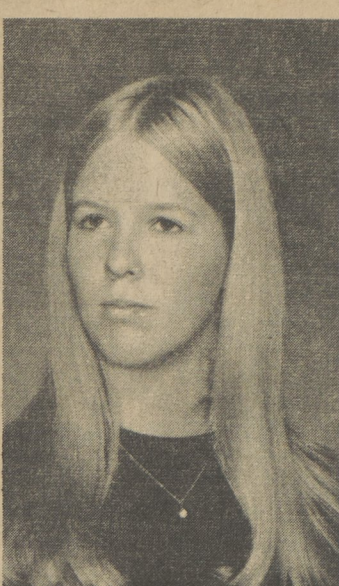

**Junior news**

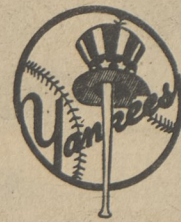
