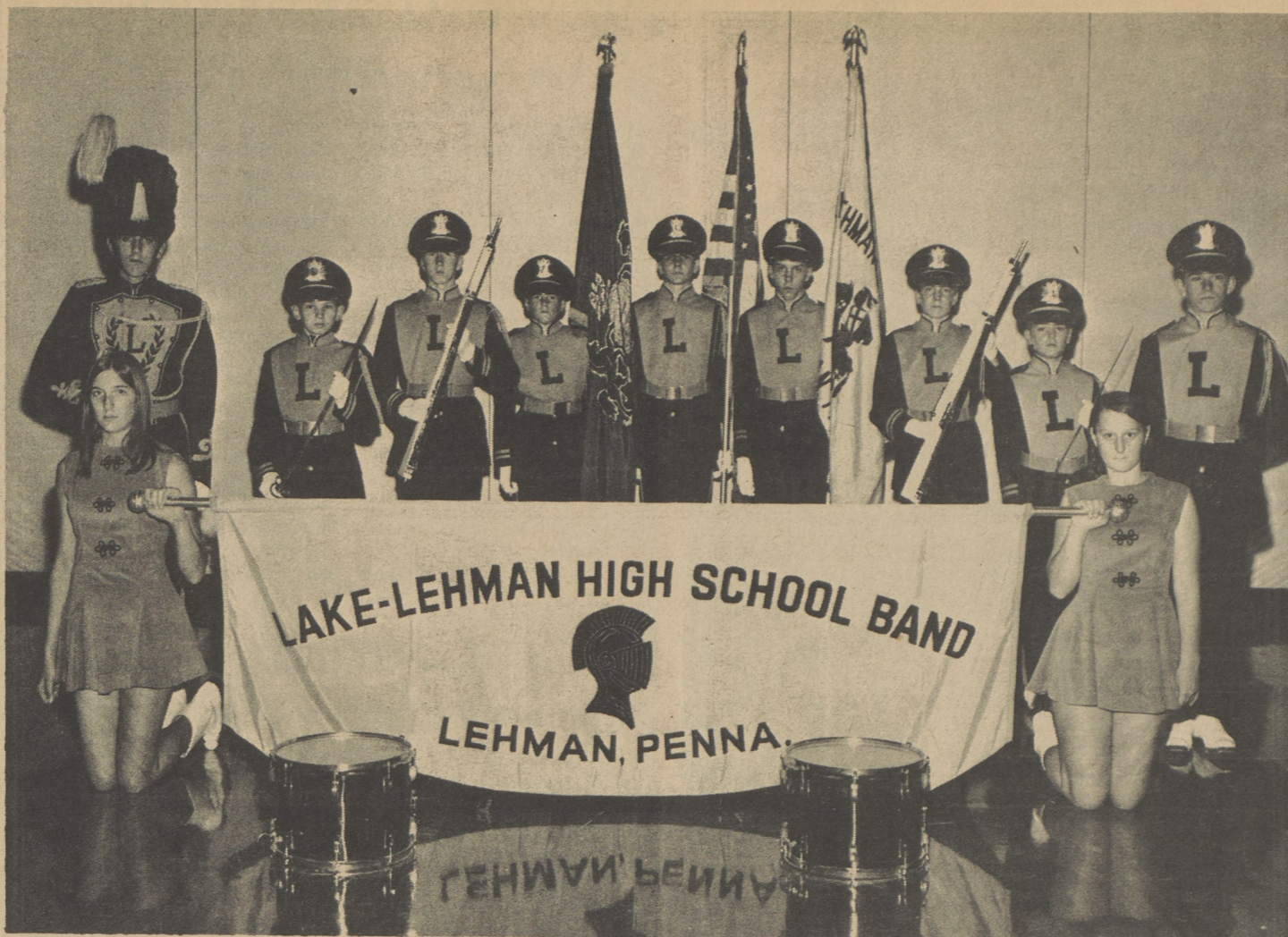
Members of the band are showing a "new look" this spring with the addition of embroidered flags on the right shoulders of the uniforms. It has been acknowledged that this is the first band in the United

FISH answers variety of calls

Fish, the good neighbor organization that comes willingly to the aid of all Back Mountain residents when an emergency arises, has reported an increase in calls. Most people reach a FISH volunteer by dialing 675-5272 and then request transportation to a doctor or dentist; inquire about housecleaning services or meals when illness incapacitates; or ask for emergency baby sitting services.

The most unique call was undoubtedly one that many women would sympathize with—call to remove a mouse from the kitchen. When the volunteers arrived, the furry guest had fled, but FISH offered to provide a live-in-cat for future emergencies. Another hu-

morous situation arose when the Rev. William Bispels, a member of the FISH steering committee, was out on an emergency FISH call as a volunteer and his wife, Judy, had to call FISH herself for emergency transportation.

FISH has also found hospital beds and walkers; run errands; put senior citizens in touch with the Reach Out For Life agency, and shoveled snow in an emergency. Volunteers performing these tasks range in age from 13 years to couples in their late 70's.

There are over 100 volunteers presently available to serve you. They are as close to you as your telephone. More volunteers would of course be welcome, particularly couples to answer night calls.

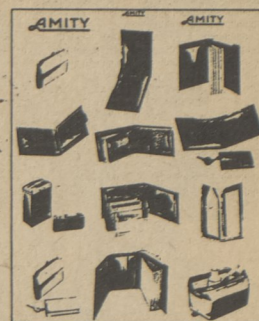
The troop leader is Betty Smith. Lois Engelman is chairman of the sale.
