NNI retains new circulation mgr.




Philip Fitelson

He was with The New York Herald Tribune's circulation department for 18 years where he was a traveling representative in charge of a 22-state area. He also was a circulation representative with The Jersey Journal, Jersey City, N.J., The Hudson Dispatch, Hudson, N.Y.; The Yonkers Herald (now the Herald-Statesman), Yonkers, N.Y., and The Omaha World Herald, Omaha, Neb.


