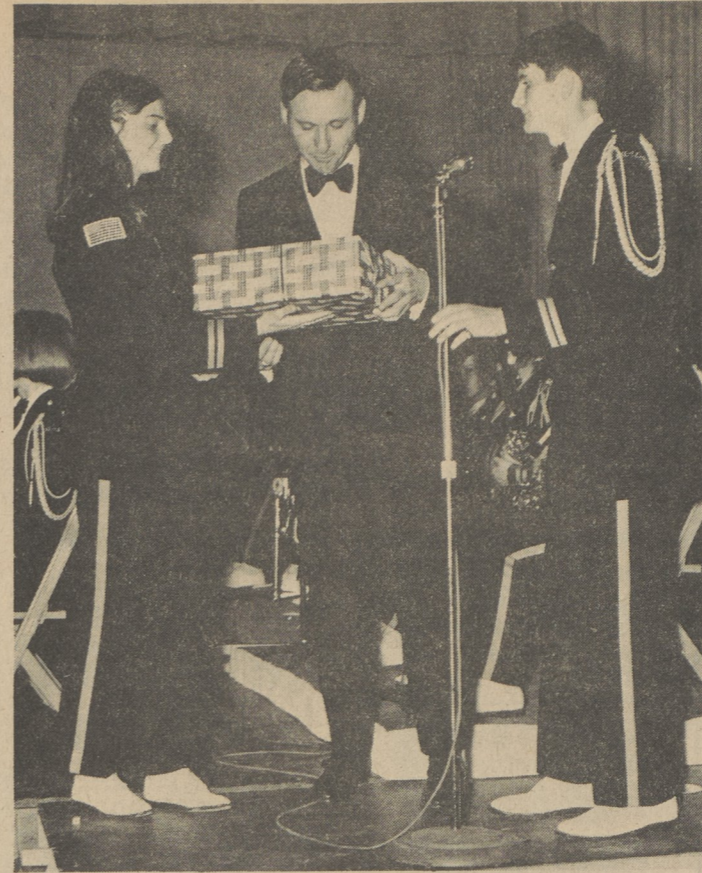
woman's club honors mothers
