

Whitesell to train men under JOBS

Seven disadvantaged jobs workers will train at Whitesell Brothers General Contractors, Inc., Dallas, under the JOBS program, the U.S. Department of Labor announced last week.

The trainees will be phased into Whitesell Brothers during the first three months of its 18-month contract with the Labor Department. Elwood Whitesell is in charge of the JOBS program for the firm.

Regional Manpower Administrator William R. Curtis said the department had approved a \$8386 contract with the firm to provide the new hires with 18 months of intensive training to learn the skills of a construction worker. The trainees will go on the payroll earning \$2 an hour and following completion of their training they will be permanent workers earning hourly rates of \$2.25.

The JOBS (Job Opportunities in the Business Sector) program is a joint effort of the Labor Department and the National Alliance of Businessmen to hire and train the jobless for permanent employment. The Federal funds will be used to help offset the extra costs of the firm in on-the-job training and intensive supportive services such as remedial and basic education, minor medical care and job coaching.

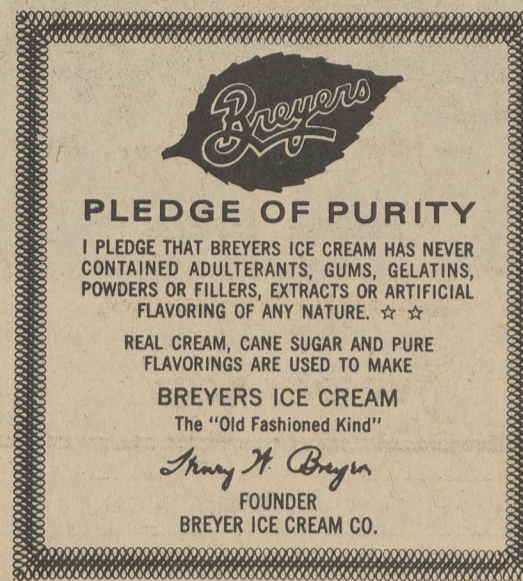
