Sgt. Chisko receives full military honors

Back Mountain residents flew their flags at half mast last week and several hundred people paid their last respects to Sgt. Joseph Chisko, the Dallas soldier killed in Cambodia June 9.

Sgt. Chisko was laid to rest with full military honors last Saturday. A large United States Army detail from the Indian-town Gap Military Reservation accorded the honors and acted as pallbearers. The funeral was held from the Harold C. Snowdon Funeral Home, 140 N. Main St., Shavertown.

A Concelebrated Mass of Requiem was said at Gate of Heaven Church, Dallas, by the Rev. Stephen McGough, the Rev. Thomas Banick and the Rev. Michael Rafferty. Also present in the sanctuary of the church was the Rev. Robert DeWitt Yost, pastor of the

Shavertown United Methodist Church, who gave a final commendation at the conclusion of the Mass. Organist was Rosemary Wester, and Paul Williams was the soloist.

In an impressive new ritual of the Catholic Church, described by funeral director, Snowdon, the American flag was presented by the dead soldier's family at the offertory of the Mass as an offering representing Sgt. Chisko's past life. The flag was blessed and put on the casket at the end of the Mass.

Burial Services were said at the interment in St. John's Cemetery, Dallas, by the Rev. McGough and the Rev. Banick. Following the solemn ritual, the flag was presented to the widow by members of the army detail, a volley of shots were fired, and taps were sounded.
