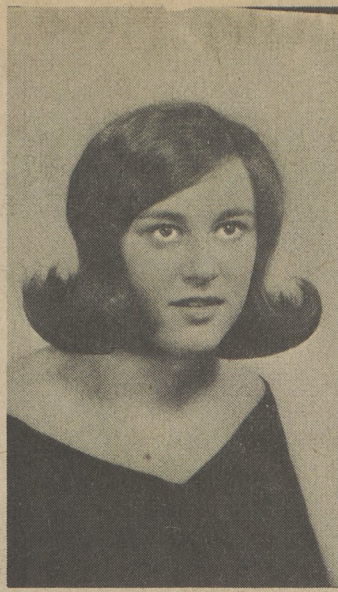
John Comitz, 22 S. Sherman St., Wilkes-Barre, attended G.A.R. High School and gradu-

ated from George Washington University, Washington, D.C. with a B.A. degree in social studies in June. At the university he was active in all sports.

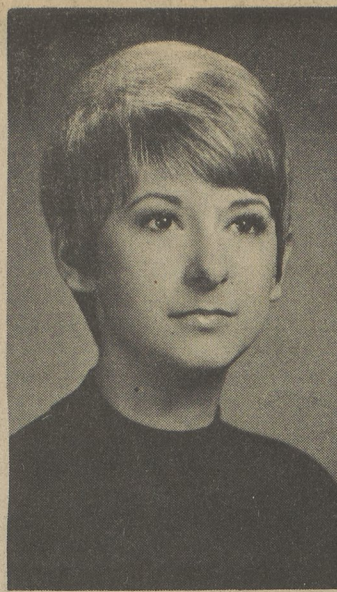

Lake-Lehman enrolls 936 at high school

A total of 936 high school students is expected to be enrolled at Lake-Lehman on the first day of the 1970-71 term. There will be 188 in the seventh grade; 164 in eighth grade; 188 in ninth; 136 in tenth; 138 in eleventh, and 122 in twelfth.

The figures show an increase of approximately 43 students over the one of 893 on the closing day of school. The above figures do not include the 60 students that will be attending West Side Area Vocational-Technical School in Pringle.

Lake-Lehman schools begin fall term Sept. 9

Lake-Lehman School District will begin the 1970-71 school term Sept. 9 as announced by Anthony Marchakitus, assistant supervising principal, with all students reporting to their homerooms at 8:15 a.m. Students will be dismissed at 3:35 and buses will depart at 3:42 p.m. The school cafeteria will serve "Class A" lunches beginning the first day of school.

All buses have been inspected and approved by the Pennsylvania State Police and will operate on the time schedule listed below, traveling the same approved routes. Students who will attend the West Side Area Vocational-Technical School will board their regular bus to Lake-Lehman High School and will transfer to an International bus for their transportation to the Technical School. Ben Swartz will be the driver.

Transportation will also be provided for kindergarten students to the attendance area. It will be the responsibility of the parents to pick up their students for the return trip home.

Following are the routes over which the school buses will travel. Last year's drivers' names as well as route numbers are listed. In some cases it may be necessary to have new drivers.

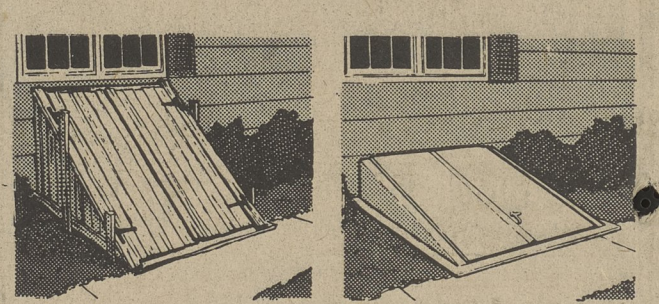
