The Teenagers' March for ALSAC (Aiding Leukemia's Stricken American Children) will officially end tomorrow afternoon, Mrs. Donald Anthony reports. Mrs. Anthony is co-chairman with Herbert Morris of the fund drive in the Dallas area.

Fifty-five teenagers collected in excess of \$300 for ALSAC, Mrs. Anthony proudly announced, and she says she is "very much pleased" with the campaign's outcome. She is especially grateful to Mabel Jenkins, Dallas High health teacher, for her aid in organizing the drive.

Mrs. Anthony informed The Post that while most of the neighborhoods were canvassed by students of the Dallas High School on Sunday, collections in a few areas have not yet been completed.

All monies collected by the teenagers will go to St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital in Memphis, Tenn. Founded by comedian Danny Thomas in 1957, the hospital conducts research on Leukemia and treats afflicted youngsters aged 16 years and younger, without regard to race, religion, or creed.

3 companies fined for burning refuse

Three companies in Luzerne County were fined \$100 plus \$25 costs for violation of State Air Pollution Commission Regulation V by S.M. Wolfe, Alderman and Justice of the Peace, 219 S. Main St., Wilkes-Barre.

Airport Sand and Gravel, Inc., West Wyoming, was found guilty of the open burning of refuse which occurred Aug. 27 on company property in West Wyoming Borough.

Ted Spencer Auto Parts, Nanticoke, and Louis Cohen and Son, Inc., Hanover Township, were found guilty of the open burning of salvage material at their junkyards which occurred Aug. 26 and Aug. 24, respectively.

Such salvage and refuse burning is prohibited in the Scranton-Wilkes-Barre Air Basin by the Pennsylvania State Air Pollution Commission, Regulation V. The above charges were brought about by B.H. Patel, Air Pollution Control Engineer from the Department of Health Regional Office in Kingston.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION APPROVED FOR THE FIRST TIME BY THE SESSION OF 1970 OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA AND PUBLISHED BY THE ORDER OF THE SECRETARY OF THE COMMONWEALTH IN PURSUANCE OF ARTICLE XVII OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

SESSION OF 1970
No's. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, & 6
A JOINT RESOLUTION
Proposing an amendment to article seven, section one of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, permitting citizens nineteen years of age to vote.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby resolves as follows: The following amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with the provisions of the eleventh article thereof:

That the first paragraph of section one, article seven of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania be amended to read:

Section 1. Qualifications of Electors.—Every citizen nineteen years of age, possessing the following qualifications, shall be entitled to vote at all elections subject, however, to such laws requiring and regulating the registration of electors as the General Assembly may enact.

A true copy of Joint Resolution No. 1.

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with the provisions of the eleventh article thereof:

That section six, article one of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania be amended to read:

Section 6. Trial by Jury.—Trial by jury shall be as heretofore, and the right thereof remain inviolate. The General Assembly may provide, however, by law that a verdict may be rendered by not less than five-sixths of the jury in any civil case.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby resolves as follows: The following amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with the provisions of the eleventh article thereof:

Section 27. Changes in Term of Office or Salary Prohibited.—No law shall extend the term of any public officer, or increase or diminish his salary or emoluments, after his election or appointment. Provided, however, that upon a change in classification of a county during the term of office of a county officer his salary or emoluments shall automatically be increased or decreased to conform to the change in classification.

A true copy of Joint Resolution No. 2.

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with the provisions of the eleventh article thereof:

Section 27. Article III of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania be amended to read:

Section 27. Changes in Term of Office or Salary Prohibited.—No law shall extend the term of any public officer, or increase or diminish his salary or emoluments, after his election or appointment. Provided, however, that upon a change in classification of a county during the term of office of a county officer his salary or emoluments shall automatically be increased or decreased to conform to the change in classification.

A true copy of Joint Resolution No. 3.

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with the provisions of the eleventh article thereof:

Section 27. Natural Resources and the Public Estate.—The people have a right to clean air, pure water, and to the preservation of the natural, scenic, historic and esthetic values of the environment. Pennsylvania's Public Natural Resources are the common property of all the people, including generations yet to come. As trustee of these resources, the Commonwealth shall conserve and maintain them for the benefit of all the people.

A true copy of Joint Resolution No. 4.

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with the provisions of the eleventh article thereof:

Section 27. Disqualification to Hold Other Office.—No Senator or Representative shall, during the time for which he was elected, be appointed to any civil office under the Commonwealth, which shall have been created, or the emoluments whereof shall have been increased during his term. No member of Congress or other person holding any office (except of attorney-at-law or in the national guard or in a reserve component of the armed forces of the United States) under the United States or this Commonwealth to which a salary, fee or perquisite is attached shall be a member of either House during his continuance in office. Any person holding an office prohibited by this section shall immediately forfeit his elective office.

A true copy of Joint Resolution No. 5.

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with the provisions of the eleventh article thereof:

Section 27. Disqualification to Hold Other Office.—No Senator or Representative shall, during the time for which he was elected, be appointed to any civil office under the Commonwealth, which shall have been created, or the emoluments whereof shall have been increased during his term. No member of Congress or other person holding any office (except of attorney-at-law or in the national guard or in a reserve component of the armed forces of the United States) under the United States or this Commonwealth to which a salary, fee or perquisite is attached shall be a member of either House during his continuance in office. Any person holding an office prohibited by this section shall immediately forfeit his elective office.

A true copy of Joint Resolution No. 6.

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with the provisions of the eleventh article thereof:

Section 26. Extra Compensation Prohibited. No bill shall be passed giving any extra compensation to any public officer, servant, employee, agent or contractor, after services shall have been rendered or contract made, nor providing for the payment of any claim against the Commonwealth without previous authority of law. Provided, however, that nothing in this Constitution shall be construed to prohibit the General Assembly from authorizing the increase of retirement benefits payable to members or beneficiaries of members of a retirement or pension system now in effect or hereafter legally constituted by the Commonwealth, its political subdivisions, agencies or instrumentalities, after the termination of the services of said member.
