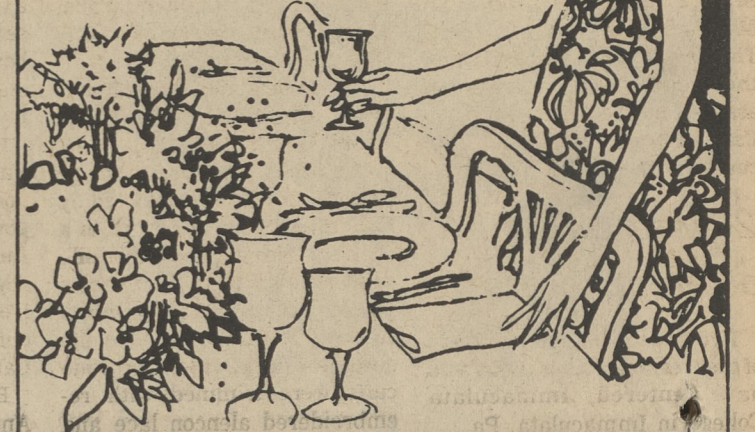
Richard will receive training in motor transport and will take basic training at Fort Dix, N.J.

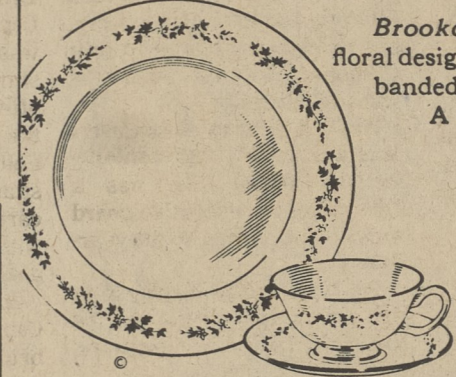

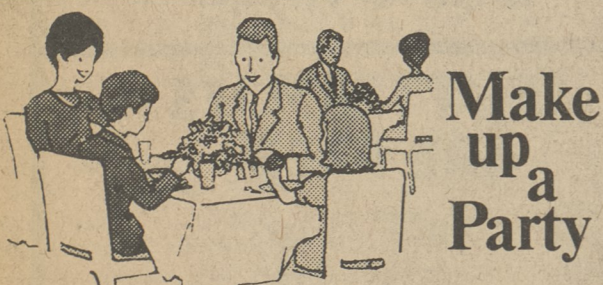
