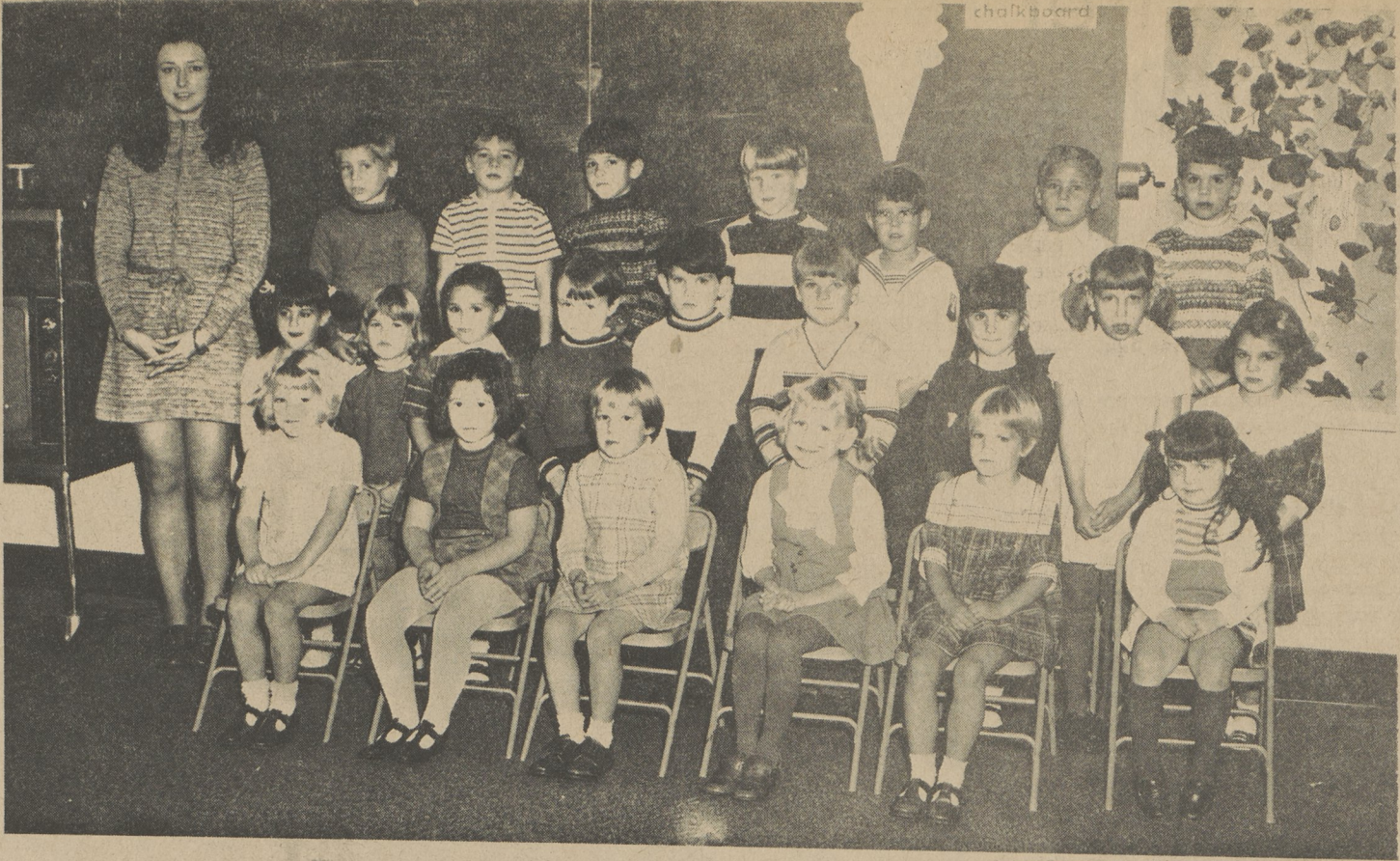

Lake-Lehman High School names 168 to honor rolls
