**sewer excavations to begin in February**

The Dallas Area Municipal Authority has authorized Roy F. Weston, firm of environmental scientists and engineers, to issue formal notices to contractors to proceed with the construction of the proposed sewage plant and interceptors for the Back Mountain. Action was taken at a regular meeting of members Jan. 21 in the library of Dallas Senior High School.

A pre-construction conference of authority members, successful contractors and engineers was held Jan. 26 in the West Chester office of Weston. All contracts have been signed.

Jan Kem, project manager for Weston, stated that excavating will be started no later than mid-February. He said a low pace would be maintained until the weather breaks in the spring.

A \$10,500 invoice was received

from HUD. R. Spencer Martin, authority chairman, noted this was a standard fee for government inspectors to inspect construction. Payment of bill approved, pending proper payment machinery being set up by the trustee, United Penn Bank.

Three invoices, in the sum of \$16,852.94, were approved for payment to Roy F. Weston. These included engineering services with supplemental documents, a 10 percent basic

surveillance fee, and right-of-way surveying.

Various lines and extensions affecting Wellington Avenue, Wies Market, Dallas Shopping Center and Midway Manor were discussed at length.

Those in attendance were Mr. Martin, Robert Dickinson, J. Traver Noble, David Coyle, John Casner and Solicitor Merton Jones and Mr. Weston and Mr. Kem of the engineering firm. Phillip VanBlarcom, authority secretary, was unable to be present due to illness.
