According to the National Weather Service, the storm system was centered along the Gulf states from Texas to South

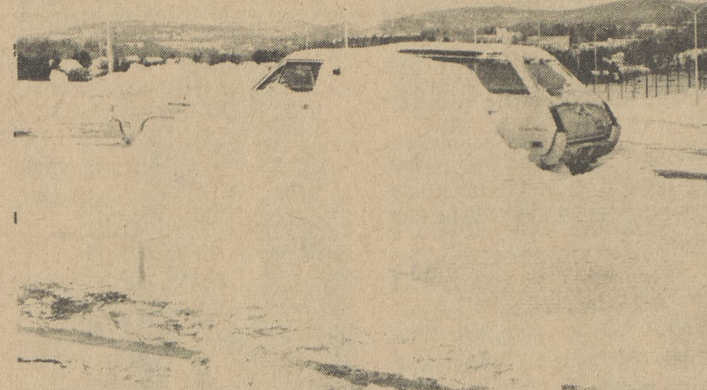
