

tire company appeal needs more support

Response to the Trucksville Volunteer Fire Company's annual fund drive has been somewhat disappointing, according to campaign chairman Jack Stephenson.

The appeal, which supports both the fire company and the Kingston Township Ambulance Association, was initiated earlier this month and has failed to bring in sufficient operating revenue to the organizations.

Mr. Stephenson has pointed out that during 1970, regular operating expenses of the fire company amounted to slightly more than \$2,600, while the operating expenses for the ambulance exceeded \$2,100. Neither figure includes money set aside as a reserve for the replacement of the ambulance or campaign. fire trucks.
