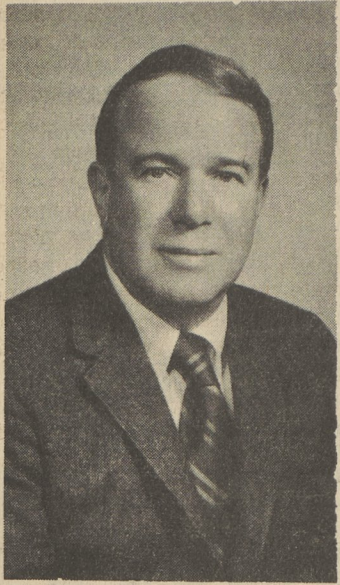


## area residents are elected to Blind Association office

Fletcher C. Booker Jr., Machell Ave., Dallas, was elected president of the blind prevention agency which has been serving the visually handicapped of this area for more than 60 years. Mrs. Richard Maslow, Sutton Road, Shavertown, was newly elected as a member of the board of directors.

Mr. Booker is vice president of Booker Brothers Inc., Wilkes-Barre. He is a veteran military officer and is presently with the 28th Infantry Division Artillery. He is also a director of Wyoming Valley Chapter,

American Red Cross and past president of Penn's Mountain Council, Boy Scouts of America.

Mrs. Maslow, formerly fashion editor for Harper's Bazaar Magazine, moved to this area from Scarsdale, N.Y. in 1958. Her community activities have included volunteer work with the Back Mountain Library and Girl Scouts, Wyoming Valley United Fund, and Wyoming Historical and Geological Society. She is also a director of the Junior League. Mrs. Maslow is listed in the Who's Who in American Women.
