written statements of their educational goals. Each of the five awards provides \$1400 to be applied against the student's college fees.

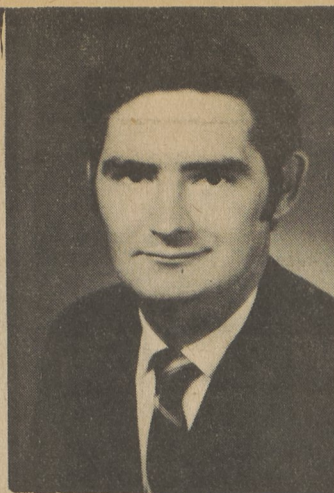

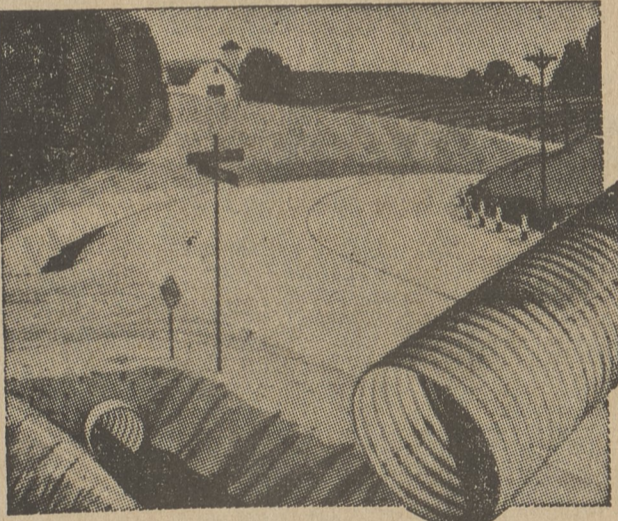
