## Dallas Woman Is Wheaton Graduate

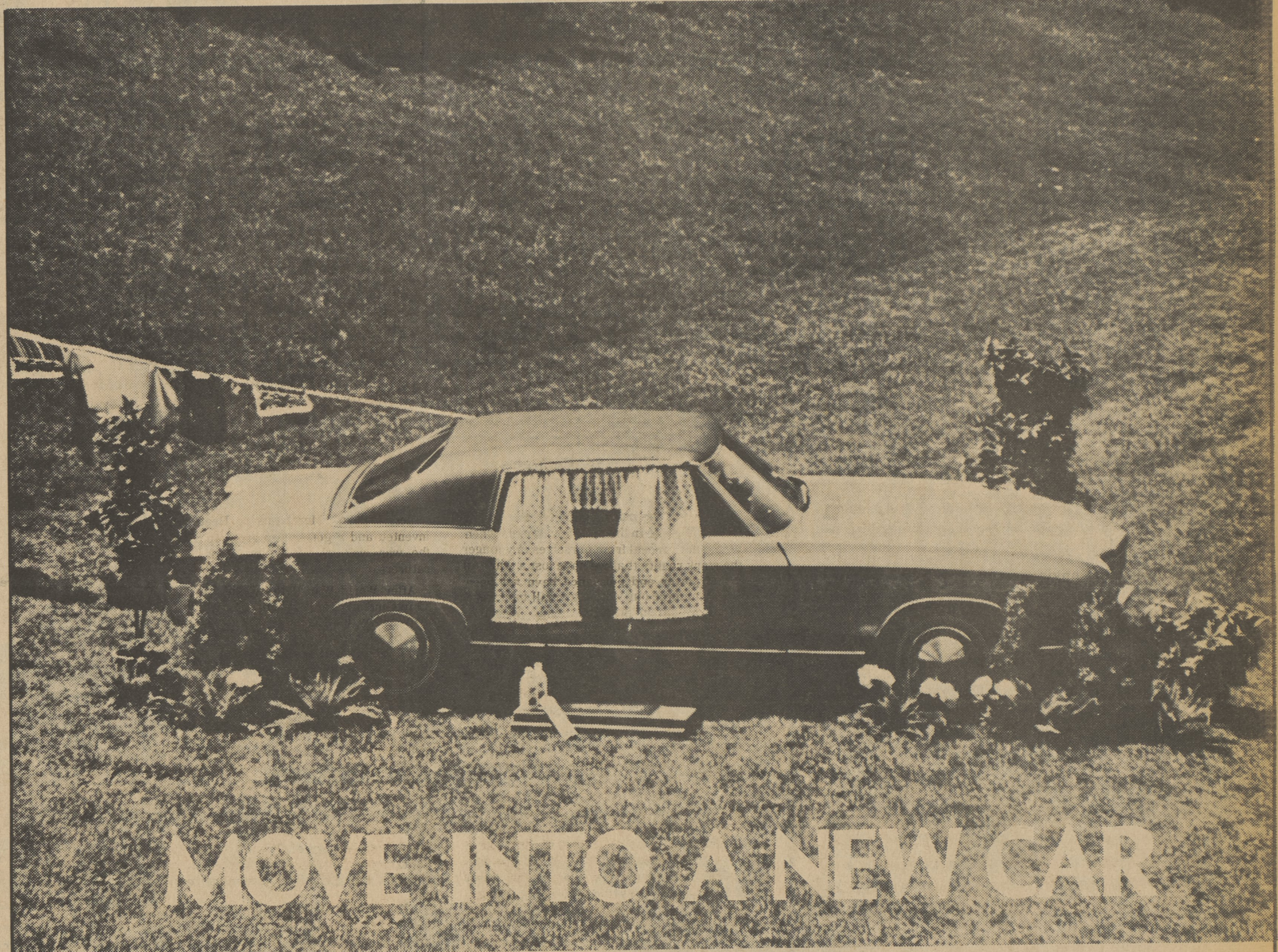
