brother of the bride, and James D. Reynolds, cousin of the bride.

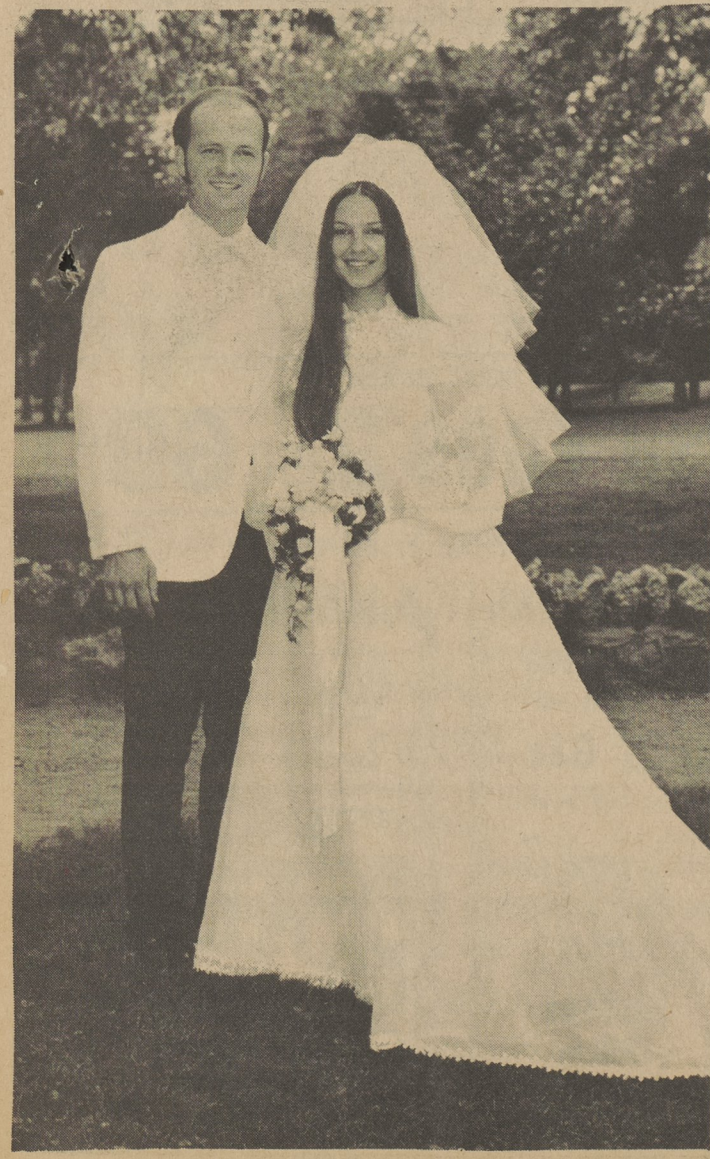
